## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4212

On page 23 of the printed bill, after line 1, insert:

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## "TRANSFER OF PAID FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE PROGRAM

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"SECTION 44. The Legislative Assembly finds and declares that:

- "(1) It is in the public interest to ensure that the people of this state are able to receive unemployment relief during the COVID-19 pandemic.
  - "(2) The Employment Department has a basic obligation to process claims for unemployment benefits in an expeditious manner.
  - "(3) The Employment Department has been unable to carry out its duties to provide unemployment benefits to workers who have experienced job loss due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
  - "(4) It is in the public interest to prioritize efficiency, transparency and accountability with respect to processing the backlog of outstanding unemployment benefit claims resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic without risking a delay of or interference with the implementation of a family and medical leave insurance program.
- "SECTION 45. (1) Not later than January 2, 2021, the Bureau of Labor and Industries shall, in consultation with the Employment Department, establish a transition plan to transfer all the powers and

- duties of the department related to the family and medical leave insurance program described under ORS 657B.340 to the bureau by September 1, 2021. At a minimum, the plan must:
- "(a) Identify the estimated costs related to the transition of the powers and duties of the department to the bureau.
- "(b) Determine the support, including staffing resources, necessary to support the bureau in establishing, implementing and administering the family and medical leave insurance program.
  - "(c) Evaluate the sufficiency of existing resources and information technology systems and identify any opportunities to use the existing technology and resources for the administration and implementation of the family and medical leave insurance program.
  - "(d) Establish measures to ensure the bureau is able to meet the requirements and timelines regarding:
    - "(A) Employer and employee contributions under ORS 657B.150;
- 16 "(B) The payment of family and medical leave insurance benefits 17 under ORS chapter 657B; and
  - "(C) The approval of equivalent employer-offered benefit plans described under ORS 657B.210.
    - "(e) Include recommendations regarding:
  - "(A) The technology infrastructure necessary for the bureau to process claims and administer family and medical leave insurance benefits for covered individuals; and
- 24 "(B) Information sharing between the department and the bureau.
- "(2) The bureau shall, no later than February 1, 2021, report to a committee of the Legislative Assembly related to business and labor, in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, on the details of the transition plan described in subsection (1) of this section, including any findings resulting from the establishment of the plan and any recommendations for legislation.

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## "SECTION 46. Sections 44 and 45 of this 2020 special session Act are
