**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 5711**

1 Delete lines 4 through 15 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the**
3 **General Fund appropriation made to the Emergency Board by section**
4 **1, chapter 644, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30,**
5 **2021, is decreased by \$1,448,157.**

6 **“SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-**
7 **ation, there is appropriated to the Office of the Governor, for the**
8 **biennium ending June 30, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount**
9 **of \$175,000 for expenses related to forest mediation sessions.**

10 **“SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-**
11 **ation, there is appropriated to the State Forestry Department, for the**
12 **biennium ending June 30, 2021, out of the General Fund, the amount**
13 **of \$844,545 for expenses related to notifications for pesticide application**
14 **by helicopter to forestland.**

15 **“SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**
16 **the amount of \$70,362 is established for the biennium ending June 30,**
17 **2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys**
18 **or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and including**
19 **federal funds from the United States Forest Service for fire protection**
20 **and for research projects, but excluding lottery funds and federal**
21 **funds not described in this section, collected or received by the State**

1 Forestry Department, for expenses related to notifications for pesticide
2 application by helicopter to forestland.

3 **“SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
4 General Fund appropriation made to the State Department of Agri-
5 culture by section 1 (2), chapter 452, Oregon Laws 2019, for the
6 biennium ending June 30, 2021, for food safety, is increased by \$237,648
7 for the establishment of a state inspection program for the processing
8 and sale of meat products.

9 **“SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
10 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Human Ser-
11 vices by section 1 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
12 ending June 30, 2021, for central services and state assessments and
13 enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$137,042 for the purpose of li-
14 censing and monitoring out-of-state child-caring agencies.

15 **“SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
16 General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Human Ser-
17 vices by section 1 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium
18 ending June 30, 2021, for child welfare, is increased by \$53,922 for costs
19 associated with managing out-of-state placements and covering service
20 payments.

21 **“SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,
22 the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (5), chapter 668,
23 Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the max-
24 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-
25 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and
26 including federal funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security
27 Supplemental Security Income recoveries and the Child Care and De-
28 velopment Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not
29 described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or re-
30 ceived by the Department of Human Services, for shared services, is

1 increased by \$119,328 for the purpose of licensing and monitoring out-
2 of-state child-caring agencies.

3 **“SECTION 9. This 2020 special session Act being necessary for the**
4 **immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an**
5 **emergency is declared to exist, and this 2020 special session Act takes**
6 **effect on its passage.”.**

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
