

# Enrolled House Bill 5221

Sponsored by Representative KOTEK (at the request of Joint Committee on the Second Special Session of 2020)

CHAPTER .....

AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; amending sections 3, 4, 7, 8, 10, 12, 13 and 16, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1.** Section 3, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

**Sec. 3.** The following amounts are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the following purposes:

- (1) *Operations*..... \$ 8,773,826  
**Operations**..... \$ **8,218,278**
- (2) Business, innovation  
*and trade*..... \$ 57,965,174  
**and trade**..... \$ **50,014,240**
- (3) *Infrastructure* ..... \$ 5,351,472  
**Infrastructure**..... \$ **3,751,472**
- (4) Infrastructure - Tide  
*Gates and Culverts Program* ..... \$ 6,000,000  
**Gates and Culverts Program** .... \$ **3,000,000**
- (5) *Oregon Film and Video Office* ..... \$ 1,253,432  
**Oregon Film and Video Office** .. \$ **1,147,182**
- (6) *Arts and Cultural Trust* ..... \$ 2,125,000  
**Arts and Cultural Trust** ..... \$ **1,806,250**

**SECTION 2.** Section 4, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

**Sec. 4.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Department of Education, for the State School Fund, the amount of [\$530,146,857] **\$330,467,530**.

**SECTION 3.** Section 7, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

**Sec. 7.** (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall establish a process for allocating available moneys in the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund on a quarterly basis to fulfill the biennial allocations made by sections 1 to 12a, **chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019** [of this 2019 Act]. The department shall set the quarterly allocations.

(2) If, in any quarter, the moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by sections 1 to 12a, **chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019**, [of this 2019 Act] or any other 2019 Act, prior

to making any other allocations pursuant to sections 1 to 12a, **chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019** [of this 2019 Act], the department shall satisfy lottery bond debt service obligations in the amount of [\$263,661,510] **\$259,868,206** for outstanding lottery bonds.

(3) After the lottery bond debt service obligations described in subsection (2) of this section are satisfied, if the remaining moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by sections 1 to 12a, **chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019** [of this 2019 Act], the department shall reduce the quarterly allocations not described in subsection (2) of this section proportionately in amounts sufficient to accommodate the revenue shortfall.

**SECTION 4.** Section 8, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

**Sec. 8.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, the amount of [\$263,661,510] **\$259,868,206** for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and premium, if any, on outstanding lottery bonds, as described in section 7, **chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019** [of this 2019 Act].

**SECTION 5.** Section 10, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

**Sec. 10.** Notwithstanding and in lieu of the requirement in ORS 461.549 (2) for a percentage-based transfer of moneys, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, the amount allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Problem Gambling Treatment Fund is [\$14,593,071] **\$14,578,599**.

**SECTION 6.** Section 12, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

**Sec. 12.** Notwithstanding and in lieu of the allocation described in section 2 (3), chapter 2, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 99 (2016)), for a percentage-based transfer of moneys with an annual cap, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, the amount allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Outdoor School Education Fund is [\$45,305,847] **\$43,040,555**.

**SECTION 7.** Section 13, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

**Sec. 13.** There are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Veterans' Services Fund, to the Veterans' Department of Veterans' Affairs Dedicated Lottery Fund, the following amounts for the following purposes:

- (1) [Veterans' Services Program..... \$ 11,915,984]  
**Veterans' Services Program..... \$ 10,525,837**
- (2) County Veterans' Service  
[Officers ..... \$ 7,166,509]  
**Officers ..... \$ 6,808,184**
- (3) National Service  
[Organizations..... \$ 477,354]  
**Organizations..... \$ 453,486**
- (4) Veterans' Affordable Housing..... \$ 1,000,000

**SECTION 8.** Section 16, chapter 670, Oregon Laws 2019, is amended to read:

**Sec. 16.** There are allocated to the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Criminal Fine Account, the following amounts for the following purposes:

- (1) Criminal justice training  
[and standards operations..... \$ 31,999,031]  
**and standards operations..... \$ 29,817,371**
- (2) Public Safety Memorial Fund ..... \$ 279,495

**SECTION 9. This 2020 second special session Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2020 second special session Act takes effect on its passage.**
