Senate Bill 5723

Sponsored by JOINT COMMITTEE ON THE SECOND SPECIAL SESSION OF 2020

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Emergency Board for allocations during biennium. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to specified state agencies for biennial expenses.

Modifies certain biennial appropriations made from General Fund to specified state agencies and Emergency Board.

Establishes and modifies limitations on expenditures for certain biennial expenses for specified state agencies.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 4 expenditures established by section 2, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2019, as the maximum limit 5 for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-6 ceipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Commission 7 for the Blind, is increased by \$500,000 for the purchase of vending machine equipment for the 8 commission's Business Enterprise Program and for the case management migration update 9 10 project. SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 11

expenditures established by section 3, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Commission for the Blind, is increased by \$2,552,443 for the purchase of vending machine equipment for the commission's Business Enterprise Program and for the case management migration update project.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the
 biennium ending June 30, 2021, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics, and Public
 Health, is decreased by \$217,493,490.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (2), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the
 biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the Oregon State Hospital, is increased by \$79,166,221.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 3 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Oregon Health Authority, for Health Systems and Health Policy and Analytics, is increased by 1 **\$576,000.**

<u>SECTION 6.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 3 (2), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Oregon Health Authority, for central services, state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$235,528.

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SECTION 11. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 4 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics, and Public Health, is increased by \$1,281,249,887.

<u>SECTION 12.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 4 (2), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for the Oregon State Hospital, is decreased by \$4,890,770.

<u>SECTION 15.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 7, chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Oregon Educators Benefit Board from the Oregon Educators Revolving Fund for benefit plan premiums and self-insurance, is increased by \$62,000,000.
