**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
SENATE BILL 1703**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 3, after the first semicolon insert  
2 “creating new provisions;”.

3 Delete lines 19 through 28 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 “(6) Authorize the Director of the Department of Revenue to disclose and  
5 give access to information described in ORS 314.835 to the Director of the  
6 Employment Department if the Director of the Department of Revenue de-  
7 termines that the administration of any federal or state law or program re-  
8 quires the disclosure of the information to enable the Employment  
9 Department to verify the identity or income level of any person for purposes  
10 related to the emergency or any consequences of the emergency. The infor-  
11 mation that may be disclosed under this subsection shall be limited to in-  
12 formation that is necessary to verify a person’s identity or income level. The  
13 Director of the Employment Department shall maintain the confidentiality  
14 of the information during and after the state of emergency.

15 **“SECTION 2.** ORS 401.175, as amended by section 1 of this 2020 second  
16 special session Act, is amended to read:

17 “401.175. During the existence of an emergency, the Governor may:

18 “(1) Assume complete control of all emergency operations in the area  
19 specified in a proclamation of a state of emergency issued under ORS 401.165,  
20 direct all rescue and salvage work and do all things deemed advisable and  
21 necessary to alleviate the immediate conditions.

1 “(2) Assume control of all police and law enforcement activities in such  
2 area, including the activities of all local police and peace officers.

3 “(3) Close all roads and highways in such area to traffic or by order of  
4 the Governor limit the travel on such roads to such extent as the Governor  
5 deems necessary and expedient.

6 “(4) Designate persons to coordinate the work of public and private relief  
7 agencies operating in such area and exclude from such area any person or  
8 agency refusing to cooperate with and work under such coordinator or to  
9 cooperate with other agencies engaged in emergency work.

10 “(5) Require the aid and assistance of any state or other public or quasi-  
11 public agencies in the performance of duties and work attendant upon the  
12 emergency conditions in such area.

13 “[6] *Authorize the Director of the Department of Revenue to disclose and*  
14 *give access to information described in ORS 314.835 to the Director of the*  
15 *Employment Department if the Director of the Department of Revenue deter-*  
16 *mines that the administration of any federal or state law or program requires*  
17 *the disclosure of the information to enable the Employment Department to*  
18 *verify the identity or income level of any person for purposes related to the*  
19 *emergency or any consequences of the emergency. The information that may be*  
20 *disclosed under this subsection shall be limited to information that is neces-*  
21 *sary to verify a person’s identity or income level. The Director of the Employ-*  
22 *ment Department shall maintain the confidentiality of the information during*  
23 *and after the state of emergency.]*

24 **“SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 401.175 by section 2 of this**  
25 **2020 second special session Act become operative on the earlier of:**

26 **“(1) The date on which the state of emergency, including any ex-**  
27 **tension of the state of emergency, is no longer in effect; or**

28 **“(2) March 1, 2021.**

29 **“SECTION 4. This 2020 second special session Act being necessary**  
30 **for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety,**

1 **an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2020 second special session**  
2 **Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
