# Oregon Demographics

#### **Total population**

- Population, 2020: 4,237,256
- Population, 2010: 3,831,074
- Growth, 2010-2020: +406, 182 (+10.6%)

#### Largest group:

- White, Non-Hispanic (2020): 71.7% (+30,310)
- White, Non-Hispanic (2010): **78.5**%


#### Largest minority group:


- Hispanic or Latino (2020): 13.9% (+138,695)

- Multiracial, Non-Hispanic (2010): 2.9%









#### Counties

#### Counties


- Deschutes had the largest population growth by percent, followed by Crook and Polk

Current Oregon Congressional Districts:


Population Balance as of the 2020 Census (based on 6 districts)

District 27 has the largest population (163,025)


