One potential option to look at to keep a single payer/universal health care program affordable is to look at all the different types of treatments for a single disease, injury, or diagnosis. A single disease could have six completely different types (options) of treatments for a patient that may all be equally effective but substantially different in cost. The same can be said about the numerous medical devices for a single type of injury or health issue. A single payer/universal health care type program may decide to only cover the lowest costing but most effective treatment(s) which would lead to a significant amount of savings. A program may decide not to cover hip replacement for someone in their 90's. The public could then choose to purchase additional/supplemental health insurance that covers everything that the single payer/universal health care program does not cover. Several countries around the world use this model to keep their universal health care costs down.
