I worked at the University of Oregon for 20 years, the last 6 years in central administration. We worked hard to maintain town and gown relationships. With more students living off campus, this relationship is very important. I support House District Map C, which includes more of the university as a community of interest. Map A divides the University into 3 different House Districts and 3 different Senate Districts. How can the University and these districts communicate with each other?

In terms of the Congressional districts, the relationship between Florence and Eugene, both in Lane County, is important. Florence depends upon Eugene/Springfield for state, bus, railway transportation, for advanced medical service, and for affordable housing development. Plan A retains the relationship between Florence and Eugene/Springfield, along with the relationship between middle and southern coastal towns. Plan A retains this community of interest and informs services that support both rural and urban needs.
