

RAPID ASSESSMENT OF PANDEMIC IMPACT ON DEVELOPMENT - EARLY CHILDHOOD RAPID-EC



The RAPID-EC project is an early childhood family well-being survey designed to gather essential information in a continuous manner regarding the needs, health promoting behaviors, and well-being of children and their families during the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States. The survey focuses on better understanding child development (and parents' concerns about development over time), caregiver mental health and wellbeing, and caregiver needs and utilization of resources.

RAPID-EC collects data from caregivers in all 50 states. The survey collects snapshots of data across time with the ability to assess trends longitudinally. Twice per month, the team posts analyses of survey findings, including policy recommendations and resources for additional reading.

RAPID-EC launched its first survey on April 6, 2020 and currently plans to continue the survey through 2021.
