To the Redistricting committee:

By law, legislators must follow these guidelines when forming district boundaries:

- 1. Each district, as nearly as practicable, shall
- a. be Contiguous
- b. be of equal population,
- c. utilize existing geographic or political boundaries,
- d. not unnecessarily divide communities of interest and are connected by transportation links
- 2.No district shall be drawn for the purpose of favoring any political party, incumbent legislator or other person.
- 3.No district shall be drawn for the purpose of diluting the voting strength of any language or ethnic minority group.
- 4.Two state House of Representative districts shall be wholly included within a single state senatorial district. [1979 c.667 §1; 1981 c.864 §2]

Congressional Plan A is a partisan gerrymandered map. According to the Willamette Week, the only way to get Democrats an additional seat is by gerrymandering. This is exactly what this plan does. Plan A unnecessarily divides the city of Salem 5 ways to combine its populated urban areas with rural ones, which will keep rural communities from being properly represented.

Plan C uses weak transportation links, separates communities of interest, and unnecessarily pairs urban and rural areas to disenfranchise rural communities.

Congressional Plan B keeps communities of interest together and will better represent constituencies.

Please follow Oregon law and draw the new lines in a fair and non-partisan way!
