Historical Large Wildfires in Oregon by Decade



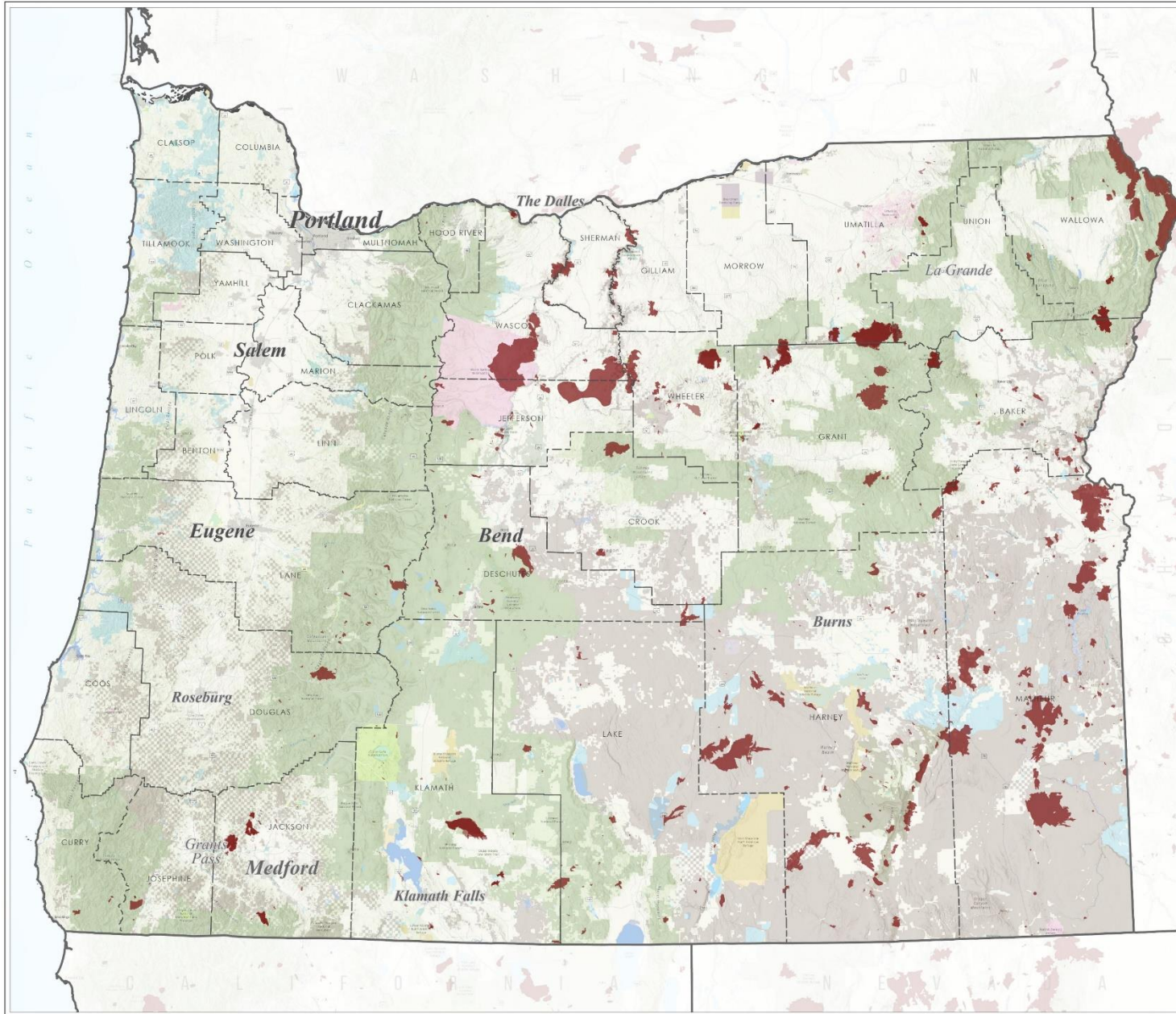

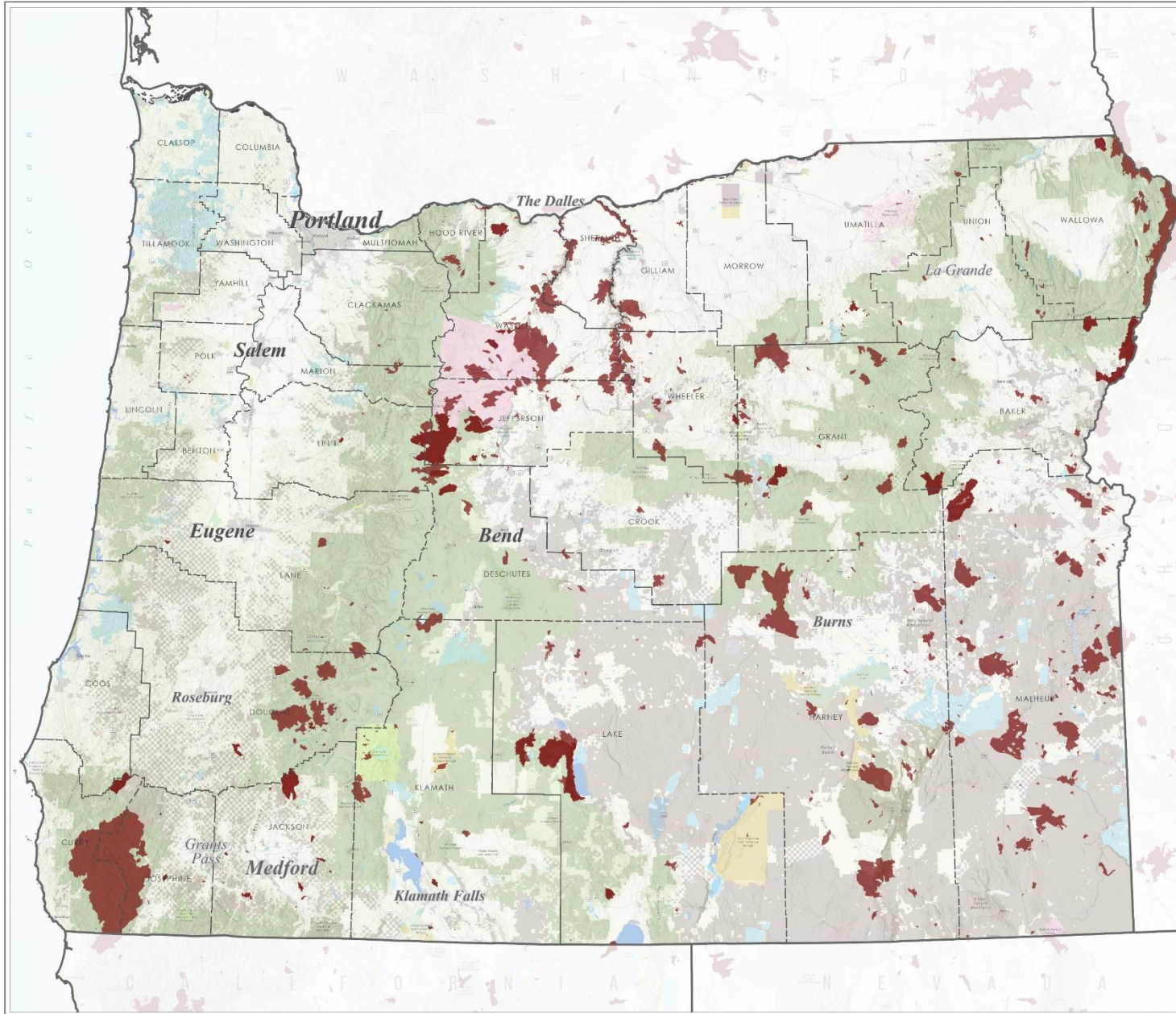

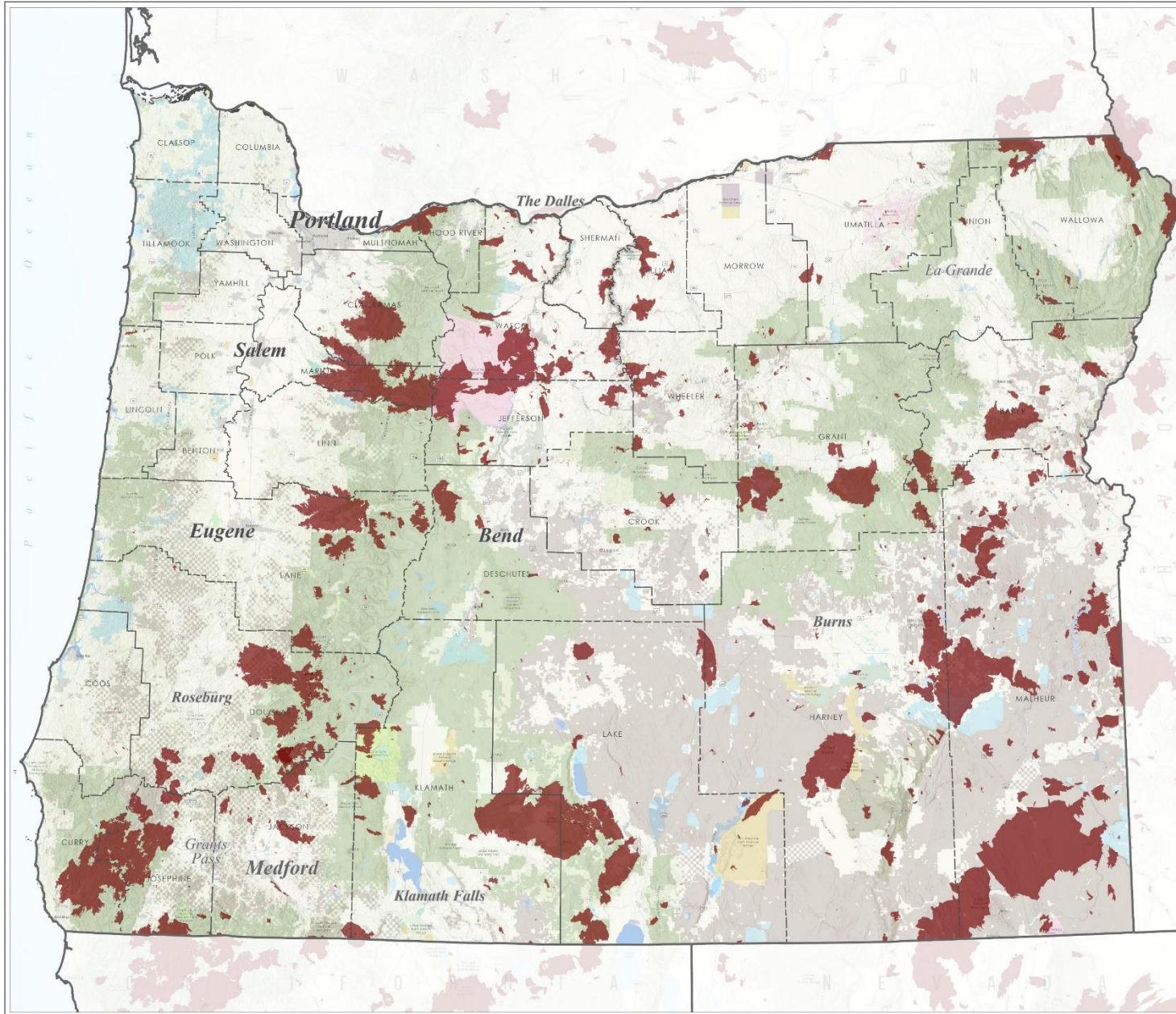

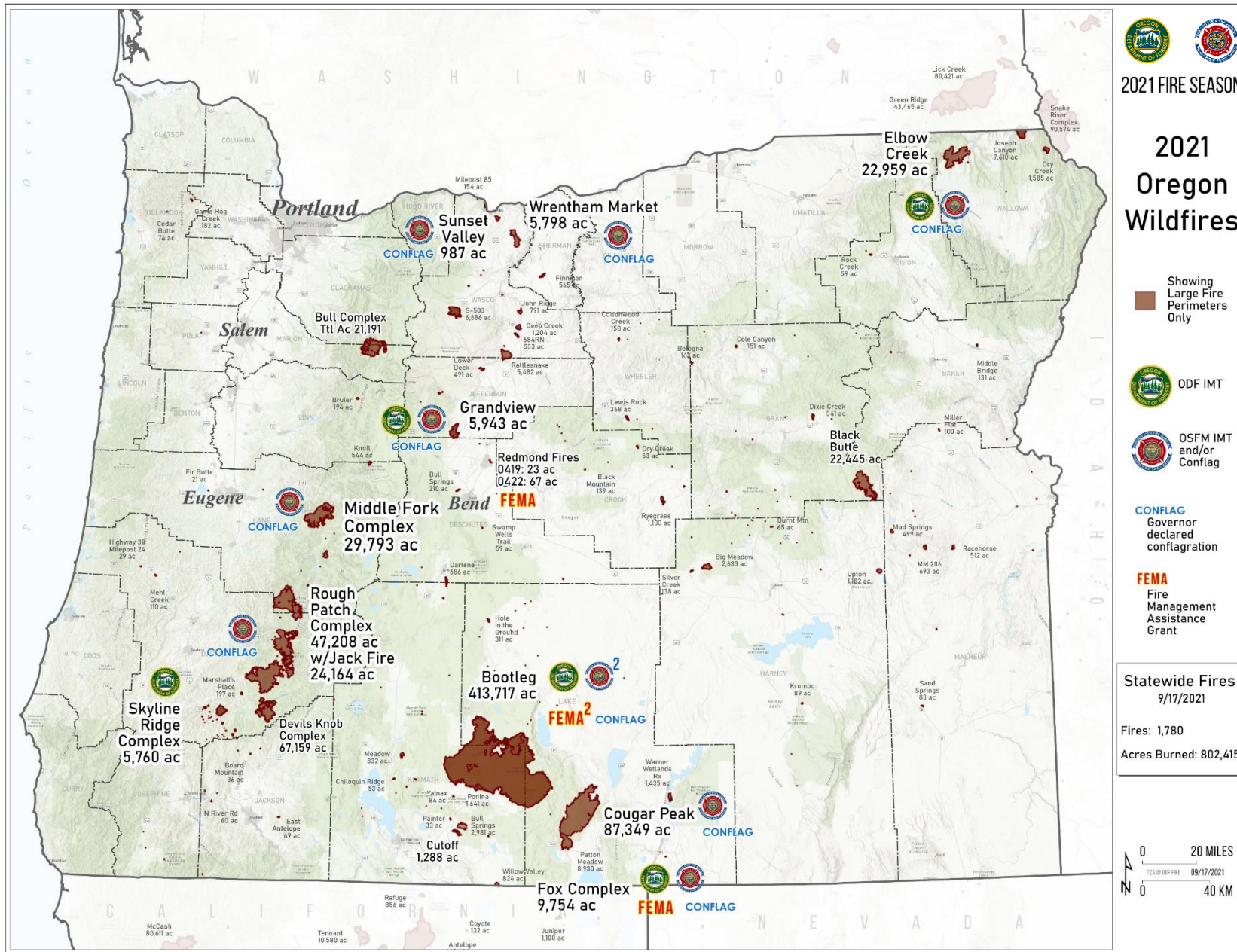

OSFM 2021 Fire Season: By the Numbers

- Response
 - 57 Oregon Task Forces
 - 12 EMAC Task Forces/Strike Teams from 3 states: CA, UT, WA
 - 121 Oregon Fire Agencies
 - Approximately 394 pieces of fire apparatus
 - Approximately 821 Oregon fire personnel assigned
 - Responses in 11 Counties
- 817,782 Total acres burned in Oregon



OSFM 2021 Fire Season: By the Numbers

- Loss
 - 1 firefighter and 0 civilians
 - 12,519 Structures Threatened
 - \$2,539,750,885 Estimated value of protected residences
 - 166 Residences lost, 1 commercial
 - 255 Other buildings lost
- OSFM Costs to Date
 - Over \$21,500,000



2021 ODF Fire Season Costs



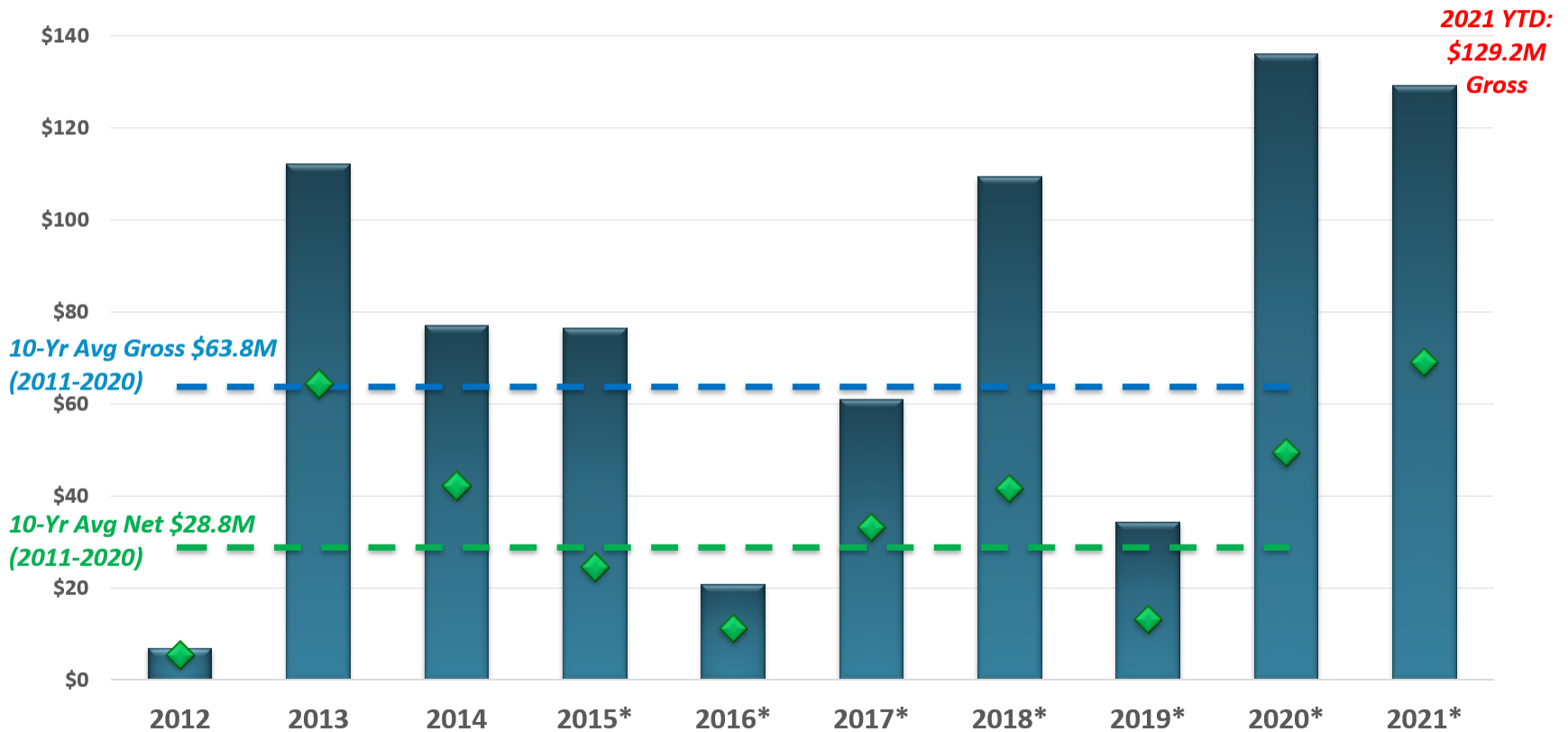
ODF Large Fire Costs 2012 - 2021

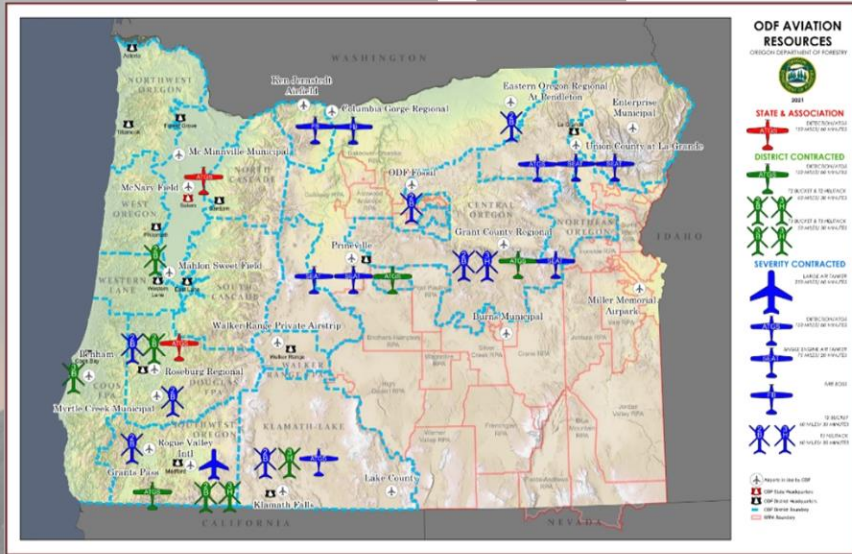
