Defensible Space Code

DEFENSIBLE SPACE CODE TIMELINE

SEP. '21 - DEC. '21

- Develop/Update stakeholder interest list
- Engage in RAC Processes.

DEC. '21 - JAN. '22

- Develop a "framework" Defensible Space Code based on 762 language (603, 604, Best Management Practices, etc.)

DEC. '21 - MAY '22

- OSFM begins Defensible Space Code Adoption and Development with constituents and partners in regular meetings

MAY '22 - JUN. '22

- Defensible Space Committee will make Oregon Defensible Space Code recommendations to the Oregon Fire Code Advisory Board (OF-CAB)

JUN. '22 - JUL. '22

***Must have 90% of this process completed by July 1, 2022

- OF-CAB will review Defensible Space recommendations and send to the State Fire Marshal

JUL. '22 - DEC. '22

- Final Notice of Proposed rulemaking & Hearing Notice
- Host Public Meetings
- Submit final notices to Oregon Bulletin per OAR 192.610
- Submit Drafts for International Code Council Review

Tentative Code Adoption Date: December 2022
