A conservation easement is a


- voluntary legal agreement
- between a landowner and land trust or government agency that
- permanently limits use of the land to protect its conservation values
- landowner retains land ownership!

OAHP Would bring in Federal Dollars

NRCS ACEP-ALE matches working lands easements 50-75%

States with funded match programs bring in 3.7 times as much \$

Oregon has only received <u>0.4%</u> of ACEP-ALE Funds.





2019 - 28 projects around Oregon would have protected 76,000 acres

2018 Farm Bill allocates \$450M/year 2021 Spending package allocates \$1.7B 2023 Farm Bill – advocating for more

NRCS will be more likely to allocate to Oregon if we have a funded match
