
Weekly Update: Oregon Emergency Rental Assistance Program

November 15, 2021

On Friday, OHCS <u>announced</u> a pause on accepting new applications for the statewide OERAP program for six weeks, starting on Wednesday, Dec. 1, at 11:59 p.m. We estimate that nearly all of the \$289 million in federal emergency rental assistance allocated by the U.S. Department of Treasury to the state of Oregon has been requested, and the program will be fully subscribed in the coming weeks. We ask that you continue to encourage your constituents to apply for assistance as soon as possible at oregonrentalassistance.org by Dec 1st. Tenants can call 211 to see what local level programs are available. To date, the statewide OERAP program has paid more than \$130 million in federal emergency rental assistance to nearly 20,000 Oregon renters – more than \$10M paid last week. We recognize the need is significant and ongoing.




