OERAP By the Numbers

- More than \$141 M in OERAP rent and utilities paid to households since May
- Rental assistance distributed has more than doubled since 10/4
- More than twice as many households have been served since 10/4
- OHCS remains a top performer nationally

Oregonians at Risk of Eviction: Applications Older Than 60/90 Days


- Application processing times vary across the state
- Counties with the oldest applications pending payment: Multnomah, Washington, Marion, Clackamas, Lane, Jackson





Safe Harbor period begins when a landlord is notified, OHCS does not have access to that data.

ERAl and ERA2: All Hands on Deck

- To avoid loss of any capacity, processing for ERA 1 and ERA 2 is happening concurrently. LPAs will continue to process their ERA1 allocations as PPL processes applications under ERA2
- 105 PPL staff are processing applications on behalf of counties with applications outside the 60-/90-day Safe Harbor Window, PPL continues staff up with 45 new PPL staff on boarding this week
- PPL has processed close to 700 applications in the last week, exceeding the 500/week target






OERAP Funds Close to Fully Requested

Paid

ERA2 provides an additional \$117.5 M in rental assistance resources, processing began last week. Combined, \$289 M in rental assistance was provided to OHCS for ERA1 and ERA2.

Funds may be fully requested before the pause on new applications begins on 12/1

Potential Reallocated Resources

- Because OHCS is a top performer, Oregon is eligible for more funds from U.S. Treasury
- OHCS has submitted a formal request for \$198M in additional rental assistance funding to U.S. Treasury
- We believe that reallocations are unlikely to be at that level, and reallocations likely will not occur until Spring 2022

Overview of Oregon Emergency Rental Assistance Program

- Federal program established in December, \$204 million allocated to OHCS and \$282 million total (direct allocations to Tribal Governments, City of Portland & Lane, Marion, Multnomah, Clackamas & Washington Counties)
- Additional resources from ARPA; \$156 million and approx. \$222.5 million statewide (same jurisdictions)
- Centralized application to increase access (address concerns with 2020 rental assistance programs) and meet robust and rigorous reporting requirements, improve transparency
- <u>The nation is building an emergency rental assistance program for the first time in history.</u>
- Federal benchmark is to 65% of funds obligated by 9/30/21 (OHCS met benchmark and requested more funds)



Applications in Three Primary Stages





















Unpaid Applications Over 60 Days as of Nov. 10, 2021



Processing Volume by Program Administrator




