STATE APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING COUNCIL

The Governor has appointed the following individual to the State Apprenticeship and Training Council subject to Senate confirmation.¹

Appointees

Nathan Phillips of Eugene; New Appointment
Evan Stuart of Pleasant Hill; New Appointment

Term

Phillips: November 19, 2021 – November 18, 2025
Stuart: November 19, 2021 – May 24, 2022

Statement of Economic Interest²

Not required.

Statutory Requirements³

The council consists of nine members including the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries and eight members appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. Appointed members serve four-year terms. Appointees must include:⁴

- four members from apprenticeable building and construction crafts or trades that have programs approved and registered with the council, including two members representing employers (**PHILLIPS, STUART**), and two members representing employees (GARZA, SWENSON);
- two members from other apprenticeable occupations that have programs approved and registered with the council, including one member representing employers (POPMA) and one member representing employees (BENEDICT) and,
- two members representing the public (BURCH, ESPINOZA VALDEZ).

Appointees must demonstrate:

- active participation on an apprenticeship governing body for a minimum of four years; or
- a minimum of four years of experience in workforce development or investment activities, vocational training or education, apprenticeship program administration or a related discipline.

The council must hold at least four regular public meetings each year. The Commissioner serves as the chairperson of the council with the power to cast the deciding vote in the case of a tie. The council must choose from among its members a vice chairperson to preside at meetings and perform other functions of the chairperson when the Commissioner is absent.

Duties and Authority

The council must, under the direction of the Apprenticeship and Training Division of the Bureau of Labor and Industries, enforce the state's apprenticeship and training statutes.⁵

The council and division must:⁶

- establish policy of the program so as to encourage the promotion, expansion and improvement of programs of apprenticeship and training;
- review, approve, and register program standards and modifications to program standards submitted by appropriate local joint committees;
- establish committees and approve nominations of members and alternates to local joint committees and state joint committees to ensure balanced representation of employer and employee groups;
- deregister standards and terminate entire programs, and remove any or all members of any committee, for inactivity or inadequate activity, or for failure to abide by applicable statutes;
- cooperate with interested state and federal agencies, including the Department of Education, the State Workforce and Talent Development Board and other providers of related training and curriculum such as community college districts, community college service districts, education service districts and recognized industry programs;
- adopt rules for gathering information through subpoenas or testimony; and
- perform such other functions and duties as are necessary or appropriate to carry out the purposes of the state's apprenticeship and training statutes.

The council and division may:⁷

- adopt rules that are reasonably necessary to enforce and administer the state's apprenticeship and training statutes;
- conduct investigations, issue subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum, obtain evidence, administer oaths and take testimony in all matters relating to the council's duties and functions; and
- petition the circuit court to enforce a subpoena.
