# STATE MARINE BOARD

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the State Marine Board subject to Senate confirmation.<sup>1</sup>

#### **Appointees**

Jorge Guzman of Portland; New Appointment Craig Withee of Bend; Reappointment

#### Term

Guzman: November 19, 2021 – June 30, 2025 Withee: July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2025

### **Appointment/Confirmation Authority**

ORS 830.105 (2019)

### Statement of Economic Interest<sup>2</sup>

Required.

### Statutory Requirements<sup>3</sup>

The board consists of five members appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate<sup>4</sup> (EARLY, **GUZMAN**, JACKSON, MORAN, **WITHEE**). Each member must be a resident of this state, a citizen of the United States, and, at the time of appointment, must have resided in this state for at least one year.

The board must select one of its members as chairperson and another as secretary, each of whom hold office for one year, or until the selection of a successor.<sup>5</sup> Three members of the board constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. The board must meet at least once every three months and at the call of the chairperson or of three members of the board.

## **Duties and Authority**

The board serves Oregon's recreational boating public through education, enforcement, access, and environmental stewardship for a safe and enjoyable experience.<sup>6</sup>

The board must:<sup>7</sup>

- maintain and distribute a report of stolen and recovered boats;
- administer a program designed to beautify and protect the state's rivers through the removal of litter and invasive species;
- establish and implement a program to provide mandatory boating safety education;
- administer registration requirements for boats, and maintain specified records, including certificate of title, for boats, floating homes, and boathouses;
- cooperate with state and federal agencies to promote uniformity of the laws relating to boating and their enforcement;
- advise and assist county sheriffs and other peace officers in the enforcement of laws relating to boating;
- study, plan, and recommend the development of boating facilities throughout the state which will promote the safety and pleasure of the public through boating;
- publicize the advantage of safe boating;
- appoint and require the bonding of agents to issue a temporary permit to operate a boat;
- publish and distribute boating laws and forms for any application administered by the board;
- adopt rules for the administration of specified statutes;
- at least once every three years, conduct a survey of owners and others to determine, by county, the kinds of boating activity on the various waters of the state during different periods of the year;
- appoint a State Marine Director who serves at the pleasure of the board;
- administer specified grant programs;
- administer specified funds;
- administer safety requirements for boating operations; and
- administer specified permit programs.

The board may:<sup>8</sup>

- make all rules necessary to carry out the statutory provisions assigned to the board;
- make contracts necessary to carry out specified statutory provisions;
- accept gifts and grants of property and money to be used to further the purposes of the board;
- exempt from any laws administered by the board any class of boats if it determines that the safety of persons and property will not be materially promoted by the applicability of those provisions;

- institute proceedings to enjoin unlawful obstructions injuring free navigation on the waters of this state;
- cause the removal of any obstruction consisting of logs, rocks, or other debris resulting from natural causes from the waters of this state if the board finds the obstruction to be an extraordinary hazard to boating safety;
- make regulations for specified waterways of the state; and
- seize abandoned or derelict vessels.
