## SUMMARY

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to specified state agencies for specified expenses.

Modifies certain biennial appropriations made from General Fund to specified state agencies.

Limits biennial expenditures from specified moneys collected or received by specified state agencies.

Modifies limitations on expenditures for certain biennial expenses for specified state agencies.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

## EMERGENCY BOARD

**SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Emergency Board by section 167 (1), chapter 669, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for allocation for the state's natural disaster prevention, preparedness, response and recovery activities, is decreased by \$98,725,000.**

**SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Emergency Board by section 265 (1), chapter 669, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, for allocation to the Oregon Health Authority for dental rates for**

1 **medical assistance programs, is decreased by \$19,000,000.**

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**HOUSING**

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5 **SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**  
6 **the limitation on expenditures established by section 76, chapter 669,**  
7 **Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, as the max-**  
8 **imum limit for payment of expenses by the Oregon Department of**  
9 **Administrative Services from American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus**  
10 **State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by the Oregon Depart-**  
11 **ment of Administrative Services, for expenditures and activities to**  
12 **respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency and its economic**  
13 **impacts, is increased by \$115,000,000.**

14 **SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,**  
15 **the following amounts are established for the biennium ending June**  
16 **30, 2023, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses by the**  
17 **Housing and Community Services Department from American Rescue**  
18 **Plan Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by**  
19 **the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to**  
20 **the Housing and Community Services Department, for the following**  
21 **purposes:**

5           ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services

7           Fund, the amount of \$100,000,000, for local emergency rental assistance  
8           programs and eviction prevention and diversion services.

24           **SECTION 7.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
25           ation, there is appropriated to the State Department of Agriculture,  
26           for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the  
27           amount of \$4,000,000, for grasshopper and cricket suppression efforts.

28           **SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,  
29           the limitation on expenditures established by section 3, chapter 600,  
30           Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, as the max-  
31           imum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated

1 from the Parks and Natural Resources Fund to the State Department  
2 of Agriculture for the Oregon Plan, to be used for activities and  
3 projects to implement Article XV, section 4b, of the Oregon Constitu-  
4 tion, is increased by \$1,000,000, for grasshopper and cricket suppression  
5 efforts.

6 **SECTION 9.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
7 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administra-  
8 tive Services, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General  
9 Fund, the following amounts for distribution to the following irri-  
10 gation districts:

1       **SECTION 14.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
2 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administra-  
3 tive Services, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General  
4 Fund, the amount of \$10,000,000, for distribution to the Oregon Worker  
5 Relief Coalition for direct payments to agricultural workers who miss  
6 work due to extreme heat or smoke.

7       **SECTION 15.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
8 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administra-  
9 tive Services, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General  
10 Fund, the amount of \$1,500,000, for distribution to the Oregon Com-  
11 munity Food Systems Network to provide grants to small-scale farm-  
12 ers impacted by drought, heat or wildfire, who are unable to access  
13 federal disaster relief funds or loans from the Oregon Agricultural  
14 Disaster Relief Fund established under section 5, chapter \_\_\_\_\_,  
15 Oregon Laws 2021 (second special session) (Enrolled \_\_\_\_\_ Bill \_\_\_\_\_)  
16 (LC 4).

17       **SECTION 16.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Gen-  
18 eral Fund appropriation made to the Higher Education Coordinating  
19 Commission by section 1 (8), chapter 660, Oregon Laws 2021, for the  
20 biennium ending June 30, 2023, for public university statewide pro-  
21 grams, is increased by \$250,000, for distribution to Oregon State Uni-  
22 versity for the Oregon Climate Change Research Institute for Oregon  
23 Climate Service research.

24       **SECTION 17.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Gen-  
25 eral Fund appropriation made to the Higher Education Coordinating  
26 Commission by section 1 (9), chapter 660, Oregon Laws 2021, for the  
27 biennium ending June 30, 2023, for statewide public services, is in-  
28 creased by the following amounts for the following purposes:

29       (1) \$500,000 for distribution to the Oregon State University Exten-  
30 sion Service to provide technical assistance to small-scale farmers and  
31 ranchers in accessing state and federal assistance programs.

1 (2) \$500,000 for distribution to the Oregon State University Extension Service to provide education, marketing and technical assistance  
2 for drought-resistant crops and conservation and efficiency  
3 infrastructure.

5 (3) \$250,000 for distribution to the Oregon State University Extension Service to work closely with commodity commissions to survey  
6 producers around the state.  
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8 (4) \$250,000 for distribution to the Oregon State University College  
9 of Agricultural Sciences to conduct soil health research.

10 SECTION 18. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Water Resources Department, for  
11 the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the  
12 amount of \$300,000, to contract for a statewide drought vulnerability  
13 assessment.

15 SECTION 19. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Watershed Enhancement  
16 Board, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund,  
17 the amount of \$1,627,000, to provide matching grants to irrigation districts to support investments in irrigation modernization projects.  
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20 SECTION 19a. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Watershed Enhancement  
21 Board, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund,  
22 the amount of \$2,000,000, to provide matching grants to North Unit  
23 Irrigation District to support investments in irrigation modernization  
24 projects.  
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26 SECTION 20. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Watershed Enhancement  
27 Board, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund,  
28 the amount of \$1,000,000, to provide grants for drought resiliency  
29 projects in Jefferson County.  
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31 SECTION 21. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation,

1 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Watershed Enhancement  
2 Board, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund,  
3 the amount of \$3,000,000, to provide grants for livestock watering wells  
4 and construction of off-channel water facilities in Klamath County.

5 SECTION 22. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
6 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Watershed Enhancement  
7 Board, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund,  
8 the amount of \$1,000,000, to provide grants for drought resiliency work  
9 in Klamath County.

10 SECTION 23. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
11 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Watershed Enhancement  
12 Board, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund,  
13 the amount of \$3,000,000, for distribution to the Jefferson County Soil  
14 and Water Conservation District to support stewardship practices on  
15 irrigated land that is at high risk for erosion and soil degradation, and  
16 to limit proliferation of noxious and invasive weeds.

17 SECTION 23a. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
18 ation, there is appropriated to the Water Resources Department, for  
19 the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the  
20 amount of \$3,750,000, for deposit into the Water Well Abandonment,  
21 Repair and Replacement Fund established by ORS 537.766.

22 SECTION 23b. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expendi-  
23 tures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 3 (4),  
24 chapter 665, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023,  
25 as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or  
26 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and including federal  
27 funds received under cooperative agreements with or contracts from  
28 the Bureau of Reclamation of the United States Department of the  
29 Interior, the United States Army Corps of Engineers, the United States  
30 Geological Survey, the Bonneville Power Administration and the Na-  
31 tional Fish and Wildlife Foundation, but excluding lottery funds and



1 federal funds not described in section 3, chapter 665, Oregon Laws 2021,  
2 collected or received by the Water Resources Department, for techni-  
3 cal services, is increased by \$3,750,000, for authorized expenditures of  
4 moneys deposited in the Water Well Abandonment, Repair and Re-  
5 placement Fund established by ORS 537.766.

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7 **CANNABIS ENFORCEMENT**  
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9 **SECTION 24.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
10 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Criminal Justice Commis-  
11 sion, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund,  
12 the amount of \$20,000,000, for deposit into the Illegal Marijuana Market  
13 Enforcement Grant Program Fund established under section 15, chap-  
14 ter 103, Oregon Laws 2018.

15 **SECTION 25.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures,  
16 the limitation on expenditures established by section 3, chapter 379,  
17 Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, as the max-  
18 imum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other reve-  
19 nues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds  
20 and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Criminal Justice  
21 Commission, is increased by \$20,000,000, for additional grants under the  
22 Illegal Marijuana Market Enforcement Grant Program established  
23 under section 13, chapter 103, Oregon Laws 2018.

24 **SECTION 26.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
25 ation, there is appropriated to the Water Resources Department, for  
26 the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the  
27 amount of \$5,000,000, for the expansion and enhancement of water  
28 rights enforcement activities.

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30 **OTHER**  
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1       **SECTION 27.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Gen-  
2 eral Fund appropriation made to the Oregon Health Authority by sec-  
3 tion 1 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium ending June  
4 30, 2023, for health systems, health policy and analytics, and public  
5 health, is increased by \$19,000,000, for increasing payments to dental  
6 care providers for medical assistance program costs.

7       **SECTION 28.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Gen-  
8 eral Fund appropriation made to the Department of Human Services  
9 by section 1 (3), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium end-  
10 ing June 30, 2023, for self-sufficiency programs, is increased by  
11 \$12,876,072, for case management services, rental assistance, immi-  
12 gration and legal services, and interpretation classes for refugees from  
13 Afghanistan.

14       **SECTION 29.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Gen-  
15 eral Fund appropriation made to the Department of Human Services  
16 by section 1 (1), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2021, for the biennium end-  
17 ing June 30, 2023, for central services, is increased by \$5,362,590, to  
18 provide short-term food and shelter for refugees from Afghanistan.

19       **SECTION 30.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
20 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Business Development De-  
21 partment, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General  
22 Fund, the amount of \$10,000,000, for distribution to the Oregon  
23 Tourism Commission to support a program to provide grants to out-  
24 door recreation outfitters and guides financially impacted by re-  
25 strictions related to the COVID-19 pandemic or by drought-related  
26 service disruptions.

27       **SECTION 31.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-  
28 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Youth Authority, for the  
29 biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount  
30 of \$2,000,000 for the East Metro Outreach, Prevention, and Inter-  
31 vention (EMOPI) program.

**SECTION 32.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$14,000,000, for equal distribution to the Cities of Albany, Ashland, Beaverton, Bend, Corvallis, Eugene, Grants Pass, Gresham, Hillsboro, Medford, Portland, Redmond, Salem and Springfield, for programs or services that address housing insecurity, lack of affordable housing or homelessness.

**SECTION 33.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Long Term Care Ombudsman by section 1 (1), chapter 521, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for general program and services provided to care facility residents, is decreased by \$75,148.

**SECTION 34.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Long Term Care Ombudsman by section 1 (2), chapter 521, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for public guardian and conservator program, is increased by \$75,148.

**SECTION 35.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000, for distribution to the Port of Portland to support an Oregon mass timber modular housing prototype project.

## CAPTIONS

**SECTION 36.** The unit captions used in this 2021 second special session Act are provided only for the convenience of the reader and do not become part of the statutory law of this state or express any legislative intent in the enactment of this 2021 second special session Act.

**EMERGENCY CLAUSE**

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**SECTION 37. This 2021 second special session Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 second special session Act takes effect on its passage.**

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
