In memoriam: Patrick James Simpson, 1940-2019.

1	CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	Whereas Patrick James Simpson was born on August 3, 1940, in Ashland,
3	Oregon, along with his identical twin brother, Donald Alexander Simpson,
4	to Alexander I. Simpson and Patricia Whitney Simpson; and
5	Whereas Patrick Simpson graduated from Ashland High School in 1958
6	and the University of Oregon in 1962; and
7	Whereas Patrick Simpson and his brother participated in the Reserve
8	Officers' Training Corps and were commissioned in the United States Army
9	in 1962 as infantry officers; and
10	Whereas in July 1966, Patrick Simpson was assigned to the 1st Cavalry
11	(Airmobile) Division in the Republic of Vietnam, where he served for five
12	months on the division staff before assuming command of C Company, 2nd
13	Battalion, 12th Cavalry, for nearly seven months until completion of his tour
14	of duty in July 1967; and
15	Whereas after serving at Fort Polk, Louisiana, Patrick Simpson returned
16	for a second tour of duty in Vietnam in October 1968 with the Americal Di-
17	vision, where he served as an assistant battalion operations officer and on
18	the division staff; and
19	Whereas after earning a master's degree at Indiana University, Patrick
20	Simpson served as a physical education instructor at the U.S. Military
21	Academy at West Point, New York, from 1974 to 1977, where he taught
22	boxing and, in 1976, was involved in the integration of women into the Corps

- 1 of Cadets; and
- Whereas Patrick Simpson retired from the Army in November 1988 with
- 3 the rank of lieutenant colonel after 26 years of distinguished service; and
- 4 Whereas Patrick Simpson earned numerous medals and commendations,
- 5 including the Silver Star, Legion of Merit, four Bronze Stars (two for valor
- 6 and two for meritorious service), Purple Heart, Meritorious Service Medal,
- 7 two Army Commendation Medals, Air Medal, Combat Infantryman Badge,
- 8 Expert Infantryman Badge, Ranger Tab and Parachutist Badge; and
- 9 Whereas following his retirement from the Army, Patrick Simpson and
- 10 his family moved to Eugene, Oregon, where he spent a year at the University
- of Oregon updating his teaching credential; and
- 12 Whereas Patrick Simpson then began his second career as a popular
- 13 substitute teacher for 20 years, primarily at Cottage Grove High School; and
- Whereas Patrick Simpson was active in the West Coast Airborne Associ-
- 15 ation, the Emerald Empire Chapter of the Military Officers Association of
- 16 America and the Cottage Grove Elks; and
- Whereas in 2016, Patrick Simpson was instrumental in bringing the
- 18 Moving Wall Vietnam Veterans Memorial to Eugene for four days, an event
- 19 attended by more than 18,000 veterans and members of the public that raised
- 20 awareness of post-traumatic stress disorder; and
- 21 Whereas Patrick Simpson was active with his graduating class at Ashland
- 22 High School, and he managed the traditional gift project presented in 2008
- 23 at their 50th anniversary, raising more than \$25,000 for a fund managed by
- the Oregon Community Foundation that provides assistance to disadvantaged
- 25 students; and
- 26 Whereas Patrick Simpson enjoyed spending time with his family, playing
- 27 cards, competing at fantasy football and canning jams, jellies and his
- 28 award-winning dill pickles; and
- Whereas Patrick Simpson died unexpectedly on July 2, 2019; and
- Whereas Patrick Simpson's beloved wife, Helga Susanne Schulz Simpson,
- 31 passed away on April 18, 2020; and

6	Whereas Patrick Simpson lived a remarkable life and served his nation
7	with honor and distinction; now, therefore,
