- 1971 Oregon leads by enacting the first Bottle Bill
 - Goal: Clean up beaches, highways and other public areas
 - OLCC authorized to administer Bottle Bill
 - Education and Partnership Approach
- Bottle Bill touches every Oregonian

Initial Products


 1971 – Beer and Malt Beverages, Mineral Water, Soda Water, Soft drinks (5 cents)

Expansion (as a result of 2007 Task Force)

- 2009 Added Water & Flavored Water (still at 5 cents)
- 2017 Redemption value increased to 10 cents
- 2018 Added most beverages






CHALLENGES OF INCREASED PARTICIPATION ADAPTING TO GROWTH
