LC 271 2022 Regular Session 1/4/22 (SCT/ps)

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SUMMARY

Directs Oregon State Board of Nursing to issue nurse internship license to qualified applicant. Allows nurse intern to practice nursing subject to certain limitations and under supervision of registered nurse.

Establishes advisory committee within Healthcare Workforce Advisory Committee to study nursing workforce shortage. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to health care no later than November 15, 2022.

Allows nonresident nurses to practice in Oregon for up to 90 days under certain circumstances, including in behavioral health homes. Requires facilities experiencing temporary staffing shortage to notify nurses' exclusive bargaining representative of shortage and other information. Allows person other than applicant for licensure by indorsement to pay application fee.

Directs board to support health care provider wellness program in order to ensure nurses may access program.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

(a) Perform specific nursing functions within the limits of the nurse
 intern's nursing education program;

(b) Practice nursing only under the direct supervision of a registered nurse who has agreed to act as the nurse intern's supervisor
under section 5 of this 2022 Act;

(c) Gather information about and administer care to patients; and
(d) Participate in all aspects of the nursing care process under the

25 supervision required and limitations imposed by this section.

26 (2) A nurse intern may not:

(a) Assume ongoing responsibility for assessments, planning, im plementation or evaluation of guidance of the nurse intern's supervi sor;

7 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) A registered nurse who is responsible for the 8 supervision of a nurse intern:

9 (a) Is accountable at all times for the safety and well-being of pa10 tients to whom the nurse intern provides care;

(b) Shall maintain an awareness of the nursing tasks and functions
 performed by the nurse intern;

(c) Shall be immediately available to the nurse intern through
 methods determined by the Oregon State Board of Nursing; and

(d) Shall have knowledge of the tasks and functions that the nurse
intern may perform as detailed on the documentation described in
section 2 (1)(b) of this 2022 Act.

18 (2) The board may adopt rules to carry out this section.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> In addition to the grounds listed in ORS 678.111, the Oregon State Board of Nursing may revoke or suspend a nurse internship license issued under section 2 of this 2022 Act if the nurse intern is not in good academic standing, as determined by the board.

23 **SECTION 7.** ORS 678.010 is amended to read:

(1) "Clinical nurse specialist" means a licensed registered nurse who has
been licensed by the Oregon State Board of Nursing as qualified to practice

(2) "Diagnosing" in the context of the practice of nursing means identification of and discrimination between physical and psychosocial signs and symptoms essential to effective execution and management of the nursing care.

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1 (3) "Human responses" means signs, symptoms and processes that denote 2 the person's interaction with an actual or potential health problem.

(4) "Long term care facility" means a licensed skilled nursing facility or
intermediate care facility as those terms are used in ORS 442.015, an adult
foster home as defined in ORS 443.705 that has residents over 60 years of age,
or a residential care facility, including an assisted living facility, as defined
in ORS 443.400.

8 (5) "Nurse intern" means a person who holds a nurse internship li9 cense issued under section 2 of this 2022 Act.

10 [(5)] (6) "Nurse practitioner" means a registered nurse who has been li-11 censed by the board as qualified to practice in an expanded specialty role 12 within the practice of nursing.

[(6)] (7) "Physician" means a person licensed to practice under ORS
chapter 677.

[(7)(a)] (8)(a) "Practice of nursing" means autonomous and collaborative care of persons of all ages, families, groups and communities, sick and well, and in all settings to promote health and safety, including prevention and treatment of illness and management of changes throughout a person's life.

19 (b) "Practice of nursing" includes:

20 (A) Executing medical orders prescribed by a physician, dentist, clinical 21 nurse specialist, nurse practitioner, certified registered nurse anesthetist or 22 other licensed health care provider licensed or certified by this state and 23 authorized by the board by rule to issue orders for medical treatment;

8 [(9)] (10) "Practice of registered nursing" means the application of 9 knowledge drawn from broad in-depth education in the social and physical 10 sciences in assessing, planning, ordering, giving, delegating, teaching and 11 supervising care that promotes the person's optimum health and independ-12 ence.

[(10)] (11) "Treating" means selection and performance of therapeutic
 measures essential to the effective execution and management of the nursing
 care and execution of the prescribed medical orders.

[Any] **A** person to whom a license is issued under ORS 678.010 18 to 678.448, whenever requested to do so in relation to employment as a reg-19 istered or practical nurse **or nurse intern** or in relation to enforcement of 20 ORS 678.010 to 678.448, shall provide evidence of current licensure.

SECTION 9. ORS 678.111 is amended to read:

678.111. [*The*] **An** applicant must 8 pass an examination in subjects relating to nursing at the practical or reg-9 istered level as the Oregon State Board of Nursing may determine necessary 10 to protect the public health and welfare.

(2) **The board shall issue to** all duly qualified applicants who pass the examination and meet other standards established by the board [*shall be issued*] the license provided for in ORS 678.010 to 678.448 according to the nature of the license for which application is made and examination taken and passed. The board shall provide evidence of current licensure. The board shall determine by rule the form and manner of the evidence of current licensure.

(3)(a) The board may issue a license by indorsement to an applicant qualified as provided in ORS 678.040 who has passed the examination used by the board and who meets other standards established by the board. [(b) For the purposes of the licensing procedure, the board may not accept monetary assistance from anyone except the nurse applying for licensure by indorsement.]

[(d)] (c) [Paragraphs (b) and (c)] **Paragraph** (b) of this subsection [do] **does** not prohibit the board from processing requests to employ nurses to meet temporary staffing shortages, as described in ORS 678.031 or 678.034, in facilities in this state not involved in labor disputes.

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1 (4) Subject to terms and conditions that the board may impose, the board 2 may issue a limited license to practice registered or practical nursing:

(a) To an applicant whose license has become void for nonpayment of fees 3 at either level and who otherwise meets the requirements of the board. The 4 board may, in issuing a limited license, require the applicant to demonstrate 5ability to give safe nursing care by undergoing a supervised experience in 6 nursing practice designated by the board, or by satisfactorily completing a 7 continuing education program approved by the board. The license issued 8 under this paragraph expires on the date set in the license by the board. 9 Upon the applicant's satisfactory completion of the board's requirements, and 10 payment of the renewal fee and delinquency fee, the board shall issue to the 11 12applicant a license to practice nursing.

(b) To an applicant who has not practiced nursing in any state for a pe-13 riod of five years, but has maintained a current license by the payment of 14 fees. The applicant may not practice nursing in Oregon unless the applicant 15applies to the board for a limited license and the board issues the limited 16 license to the applicant. The board may, in issuing a limited license, require 17the applicant to demonstrate ability to give safe nursing care by undergoing 18 a supervised experience in nursing practice designated by the board, or by 19 satisfactorily completing a continuing education program approved or desig-2021nated by the board. The board may not issue a license if, in the judgment of the board, the applicant's conduct has been such, during absence from 22practice, that the applicant would be denied a license if applying for an ini-23tial license to practice nursing in this state. 24

(c) To a licensee who has been placed on probation or has been otherwisesubjected to disciplinary action by the board.

(d) To any of the following persons if the person is affiliated with a
planned program of study in Oregon consistent with the standards and requirements established by the board:

2 (5) The board may adopt by rule requirements and procedures for placing
3 a license or certificate in inactive status.

4 (6)(a) Retired status may be granted to a person licensed as a registered 5 nurse, licensed practical nurse, nurse practitioner, certified registered nurse 6 anesthetist or clinical nurse specialist and who surrenders the person's li-7 cense while in good standing with the issuing authority if the person is not 8 subject to any pending disciplinary investigation or action. The board may 9 adopt by rule requirements, procedures and fees for placing a license in re-10 tired status.

(b) A person granted retired status by the board under the provisions ofparagraph (a) of this subsection:

(A) Shall pay a fee in an amount to be determined by the board for retiredstatus.

(C) May use the title or abbreviation with the retired license only if thedesignation "retired" appears after the title or abbreviation.

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WELLNESS PROGRAM

<u>SECTION 15.</u> The Oregon State Board of Nursing shall support a wellness program that provides accessible, confidential and helpful services to health care providers, in order to allow nursing professionals to receive the benefit of those services.

25 <u>SECTION 16.</u> There is appropriated to the Oregon State Board of 26 Nursing, for the biennium ending June 30, 2023, out of the General 27 Fund, the amount of \$_____, which may be expended for the purposes 28 described in section 15 of this 2022 Act.
