

# 2021 Legislative Session

- Significant investment in water in 2021 -- \$538 million
- Significant new workloads
- Maintain focus on implementing Integrated Water Resources Strategy and Strategic Plan

# New Workload

- 2021-2023 budget contains significant increase for WRD
  - Over 40 new projects
  - 38 new positions
- 2021 December Special Session
  - Drought and Cannabis
  - 32 new positions

# **Project Implementation**



- Workgroups, new funding programs, data, and associated rulemakings
- Must recruit to work on many of the projects
- Doing the best we can to get projects started
- See OWRD Select Projects Tracking List for more details




- Contested case backlog Referred 31 cases / protests withdrawn (Prior average: 2-3 cases in a biennium)
- Implementation of House Bill 2145 draft communications plan; form and electronic filing system updates in progress; domestic well assistance funding
- Dam safety contracts 13 contracts are complete for \$1 million in general funds; 4 contracts for \$2.4M out of \$4M ARPA funds have been drafted



## Recruitments

- 2019-2021 required pandemic budget reduction vacancies
- 2021 Legislative Session 38 new positions
- July 2021- Between existing vacancies and new positions, 70+ positions to fill
- December 2021 32 new positions to fill
- Takes time to: Interview, Hire, Train





## Recruitments

- Vacancy numbers changing: staff move into new positions, leave agency, or retire
  - 8 vacancies created from filling positions
  - 3 new vacancies due to staff leaving
- 27 positions filled to date
- 14 recruitments open in December
- ~90 vacancies remaining

Hired a new human resources position to help with recruiting



- Water Right Programs Backlog Reduction
  - Uncertain eligibility of American Rescue Plan Act funds
- Water Rights Work Group
  - Uncertain eligibility of American Rescue Plan Act funds
- Recruitments
  - It takes time to find suitable candidates, hire, and train
