LC 74 (2022)

LC 74 2022 Regular Session 12/15/21 (LHF/ps)

DRAFT

SUMMARY

Expands designated state agencies that must work with Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission and requires agencies to meet with commission quarterly to review and report on each agency's progress and to report process and outcome measures established under commission's comprehensive addiction, prevention, treatment and recovery plan.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to behavioral health; amending ORS 430.220, 430.221 and 430.223.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 SECTION 1. ORS 430.220 is amended to read:
- 5 430.220. (1) The Governor shall appoint a Director of the Alcohol and
- 6 Drug Policy Commission who shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor and
- 7 be responsible for the dissemination and implementation of the Alcohol and
- 8 Drug Policy Commission's policies and the performance of the commission's
- 9 duties, functions and powers.

- 2. Started Prevention Subcommittee


Goal #3: Increase rapid access to effective SUD treatment across the lifespan

Goal #4: Increase access to recovery supports across the lifespan


- 1. Working with OHA on 1115 Waiver to increase access to recovery support peers
