- 84% live below the federal poverty line

Healing Hurt People

Community-based public health intervention

- + Access to mental health counseling
- + Medical follow-up support
- + Substance abuse treatment
- + Legal + educational support
- + Housing relocation, if needed
- + On-call 24/7





















First 4 hours are critical

That's when victims are most willing to make real life changes.

- + 2020 − HHP served 112 individuals and families > 198 went unserved
- + 2021 HHP served 120 individuals and families

- + Street Level Outreach
- + Public Safety Village
- + Life Coaches
