

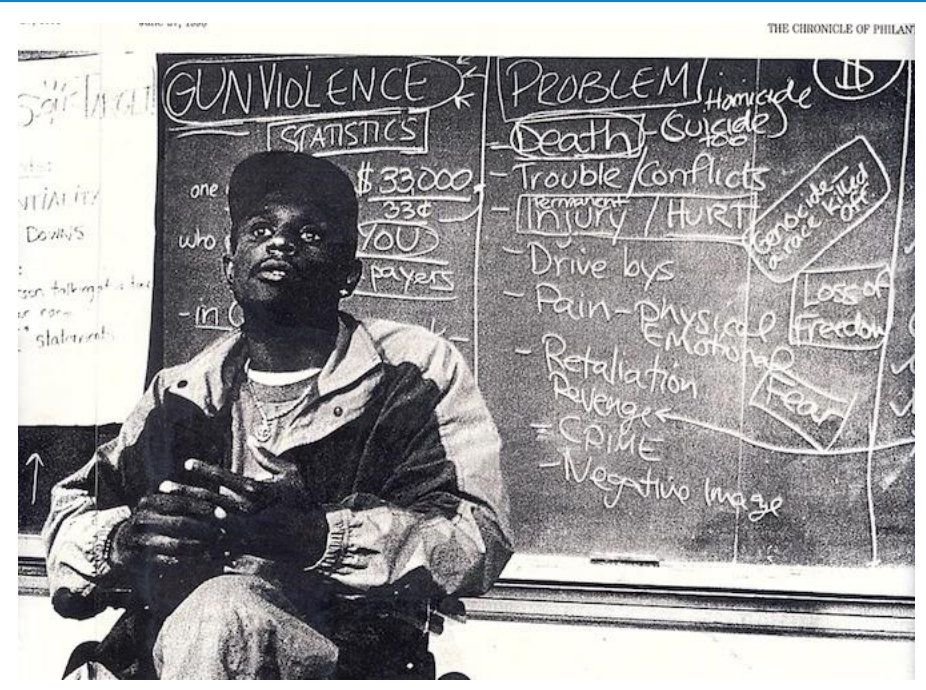
Hospital-based Violence Intervention: A National Perspective

- 1994: First program in Oakland, CA
- 2009: 8 programs met to create a national network
- Present: 50 HAVI member programs

Hospital-Based Violence Intervention Programs (HVIPs)

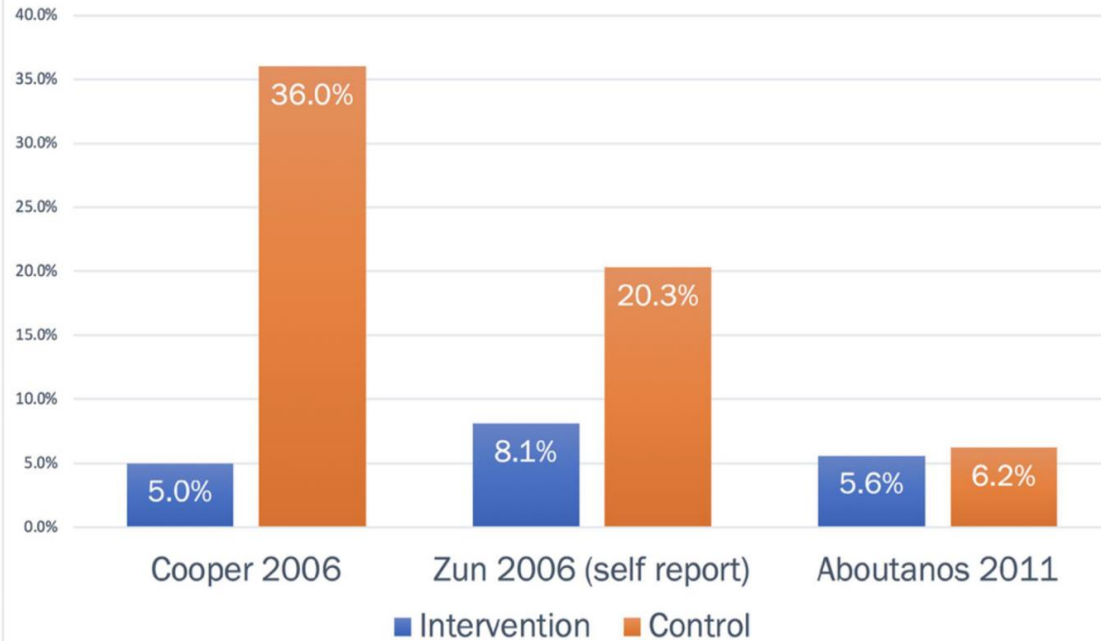

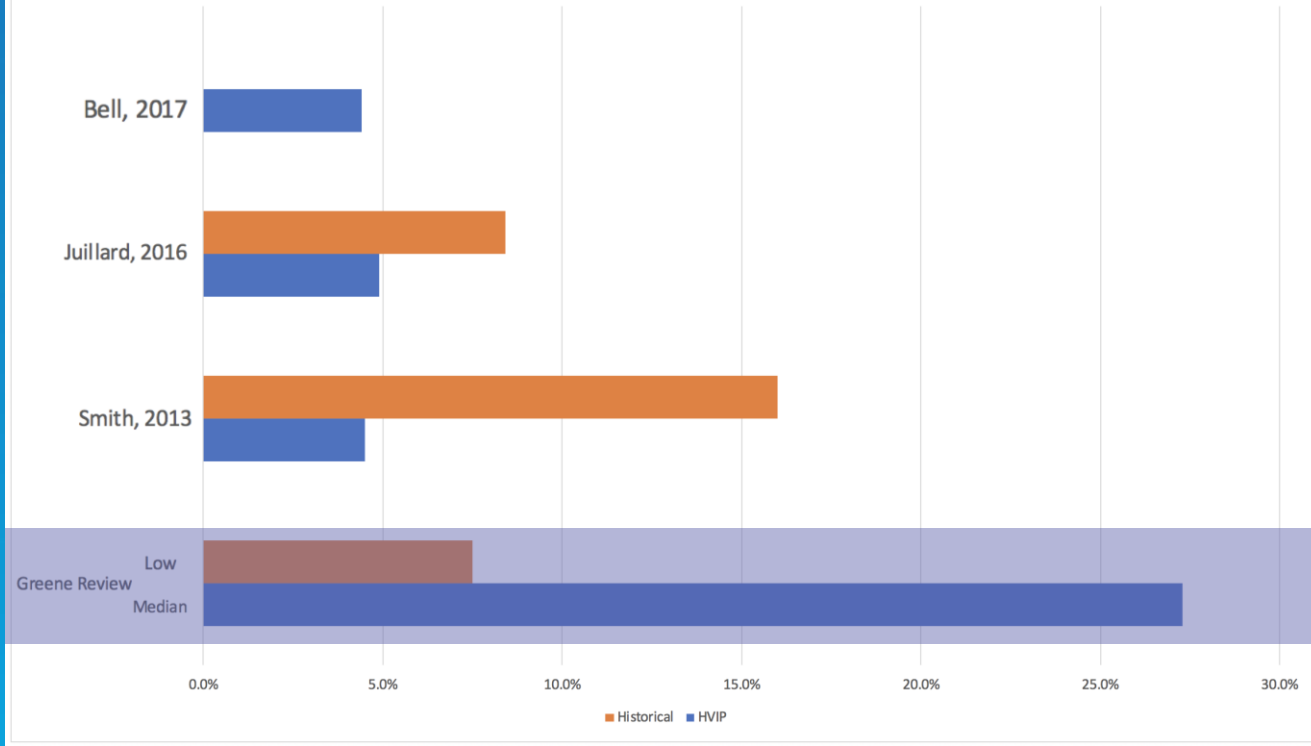

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Building Support

- 2012: Attorney General Holder's National Task Force on Children Exposed to Violence recommends HVIPs in trauma centers and emergency departments
- 2015: National Uniform Claim Committee Recognizes Violence Prevention Professionals as health care providers
- Late 2010s: Development of state violence intervention funds (MD, CA)
- 2019: New Jersey and Virginia invest VOCA funds for state networks of HVIPs

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- Opened 26 federal grant programs to community violence initiatives

- Provided guidance to states to use Medicaid for hospital-violence intervention programs

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Status of Medicaid for violence intervention

- 2018: Healing Hurt People (Philadelphia) through a waiver program
- 2021: Illinois and Connecticut both pass legislation to authorize funding
- 2022: Administrative actions and legislation pending in numerous states
