### **Onsite Septic Systems in Oregon**

- Many Oregonians rely on septic system wastewater treatment
- Roughly 10-20% of systems fail each year
- Maintenance, Repair and/or Replacement costs can be challenging for many homeowners





### Importance of properly functioning systems

- Protect Public Health and Safety
- Protect Groundwater
- Protect Surface Water and Downstream Beneficial Uses



### 2021 Legislative Session Outcomes:

- \$2 million General Fund to support septic system repair/replacement loan program established under ORS 454.770 (SB 5516)
- \$15 million ARPA funds for providing financial assistance for residential or other on-site septic systems (HB 5006)



## OR Septic System Loan Program (OLP)

- Established by 2016 Legislature (ORS 454.779)
  - Authority to pass-through grant funds to support development and administration of low-interest <u>loans</u>
- <u>2017-2020</u>: \$1.7 million in GF grants to Craft3 resulted in \$3.6M in processed loans
- <u>mid-2020</u>: Program suspended due to lack of additional funding
- <u>2021</u>: \$2 million GF appropriation (SB 5516)
  - Program re-launched in November 2021







# Onsite Septic System Financial Assistance Program (OSFAP)

### HB 5006 (Section 114):

- Up to \$15M ARPA funds may be transferred from DAS to DEQ
- "for providing financial assistance to public agencies or qualified institutions for the repair, replacement, upgrade or evaluation of residential or other on-site septic systems."
  - Grants or loans
  - Statewide applicability
  - In addition to individual household systems, funds may also be granted for large onsite systems such as those that serve mobile home parks
  - Project types may include individual connections to municipal sewer system, but not community-wide extensions

### Initial/Recent Activities:

- Fall 2021: Extensive Outreach with stakeholders and potential ulletlocal partners
- Fall/Winter 2021: Hiring two LD positions to support program • development and implementation
- January 2022: Request For Information (RFI) ullet
  - Solicitation open Jan 5th thru Feb 15th

**Anticipated Next Steps:** 

- Pending: DAS guidance and transfer of ARPA funds
- <u>Spring 2022</u>: Solicit Request for Proposals (RFP)
- <u>Summer 2022</u>: Proposal Review and Selection
- <u>Aug/Sept 2022</u>: Distribute Grant Awards
- <u>Fall 2022 (and beyond)</u>: Evaluate, consider additional RFP rounds, and potential need for ongoing admin resources
