SUBJECT: 2022 Committee LC Summaries

- LC 22 Recognizes and honors retired Oregon State Police Sergeant John Burright (1959-2021) for his service to this state.
- LC 41 Reduces the number of electors who must be registered as a member of a minor political party for the party to retain political party status from .5 percent to .25 percent of the total number of registered electors in the state.
- LC 106 Directs the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to establish grant programs related to community violence prevention and appropriates General Fund moneys for grant programs. Requires OHA to approve at least one national training and certification program for certified violence prevention professionals. Directs OHA to seek federal approval to secure federal financial participation in the costs of providing medical assistance program coverage for community violence prevention services for medical assistance program enrollees who meet certain criteria. Declares emergency, effective on passage.
- LC 143 Creates the Special Joint Committee on State Gambling to study the impact of technology on gambling access, functionality, and addiction and to evaluate the effectiveness of current regulatory systems. Requires report to the Legislative Assembly and Governor by December 1, 2022. Prohibits Oregon Lottery and Oregon Racing Commission from authorizing, licensing, or approving certain activities from the measure's effective date to January 2, 2023. Declares emergency, effective on passage.
- LC 235 Sets requirements for devices used for wagering on historical animal racing.

- LC 259 Requires Oregon Business Development Department to conduct market analyses of certain emerging economic sectors. Specifies market analysis content and requires submission to Legislative Assembly by December 15, 2022. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

- **LC 285** Establishes deadlines for completion of legislative measures for the 2022 regular session.
