Discussion of Key Issues	<p><b>Roundtable Discussion Guide</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The role for members observing roundtables; limiting member participation to no more than two individuals per roundtable.</li> <li>• Whether Lara Media can share an audio or video recording with the task force.</li> <li>• Member input on discussion guide prepared by the public engagement work group, reframing specific descriptions in the discussion guide.</li> <li>• Value in hearing directly from residents</li> </ul> <p><b>Public comment (see <a href="#">video 46:00-1:00</a>).</b></p> <p><b>Long Term Care Services and Supports (LTSS)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Summary of proposed changes based on member feedback.</li> <li>• Issue of different benefits for residents needing LTSS and residents covered by a single-payer system.</li> <li>• Vote – members unanimously approved the final draft recommendations</li> </ul> <p><b>Expenditure and Revenue Preliminary Status Quo Estimates</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Whether to exclude taxes on capital gains from taxable income</li> <li>• Confirm the state does not tax social security income and how seniors are treated differently under the existing tax structure in Oregon</li> <li>• Will Optumas consider behavioral changes as a result of the plan? Potential differences in utilization due (increases or decreases in volume adjustments) to changes in cost-sharing. Do out-of-pocket estimates include Medicare enrollees, and whether Medicare supplemental plans are categorized in “private health insurance” or “Medicare” estimates?</li> <li>• In Washington State - Optumas estimated \$4-5 billion in additional cots if an adult dental benefit is included in the single-payer plan for Medicare-eligible individuals.</li> <li>• Challenge with identifying all state and local funding streams at all levels of government to create a stable estimate for behavioral health expenditures.</li> <li>• A policy, financing, and funding question is mapping out current Medicaid administrative funding and other federal funding and whether those current funding streams will continue in the single-payer contingent on waiver authorities.</li> <li>• Can Optumas factor potential changes in costs based on improving access to care and improved population health management, and related, how to anticipate workforce constraints.</li> <li>• Optumas includes PEBB and OEEBB enrollees in expenditure estimates.</li> </ul>

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<p>Follow-up Questions</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Confirm Oregon does not tax social security income</li> <li>• Additional costs for including dental coverage in the single-payer for Medicare-eligible enrollees.</li> <li>• Are local and state funding allocated to behavioral health services, mainly for the indigent population, factored into the expenditure projections?</li> <li>• Can Optumas identify state, local, county, and special districts in expenditure estimates?</li> <li>• Will Optumas capture HRSA funding for federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) in the “revenue” estimates?</li> </ul>
