Assessment & Reporting

Does Future Ready Oregon lead to greater economic security?

For individuals, communities, businesses, industries, the State

Does Future Ready Oregon improve equity, especially racial equity?

Across workforce training, employment, industries, career advancement

We specify these questions with multiple analyses

Access

Engagement of community-based organizations

Equity to workforce development opportunities

Effective and equitable recruitment and wraparound support

Practice

Experience of grantees across funding arms and programs, focusing on equity

Experience of and equity in individuals served, by community and program

Identification of equitable and effective training programs and combinations of programs, especially for priority populations

Outcomes

The change in number of individuals employed and with rising earnings across priority populations

Changes in labor shortages in highdemand industries and extent to which changes occur equitably

Programs that equitably yield gainful employment and industries that equitably address shortages

Future investments that lead to equitable outcomes & reduced labor shortages

Assessment & Reporting Cont.

Report every year

- What is the workforce development landscape before Future Ready Oregon (baseline data)?
- How is Future Ready Oregon implemented to align with its goals?
- What are the impacts on equity & economic outcomes, especially for different racial/ethnic groups and other priority populations?

Expand data collection

- Collect qualitative data that center participants' experiences and voices and provide deeper understanding of process and equity
- Collect consistent, individual-level data across the wide array of programs: characteristics related to priority populations, services and supports received, employment-related outcomes

Synthesize findings

- Evaluate each program individually & the investment holistically; focus on equitable access & outcomes among priority populations
- Identify effective approaches to workforce development for specific communities, including pathways that combine programs
- Develop statewide plan for equitable workforce development

Next Steps

- Continue implementation: hiring, data specification, IT planning
- Deepen collaboration with external partners
- Gather baseline data







Future Ready Oregon Youth Programs Overview

YDD in SB 1545 – Section 7

- Our priority: youth 14-24 who are out of school, unemployed, or reengaging in education
- Focus on work readiness training, educational reengagement, paid work experience, and connection to employment
- \$10.5M Investment: \$3.5M General Fund, \$7M ARPA
- Funds include support for 1 FTE LD OPA3 position



Future Ready Oregon YDD Implementation Timeline

Awards Announced	August 5, 2022

Future Ready Oregon Youth Programs Grantmaking

Key Grant Program Services

- Essential Employability Skills Training
- Paid Work Experience
- Job Placement and Coaching
- Industry Recognized Credentials for viable career pathways
- Responsive and Supportive programming coaching, culturally responsive services, barrier removal



Future Ready Oregon Youth Programs Grantmaking

Design of YDD Future Ready Youth Programs Grants

- Focus on Priority Populations named in SB 1545
- All YDD programs will serve youth ages 14-24 who are not in school, unemployed, or in a reengagement program
- Grant application planned to open in mid-June, first awards announced August 2022
- Eligible costs reimbursable back to earlier possible date June 1, 2022
- Innovations: transparent and responsive participant intake process, working with BOLI on incorporating "know your employment rights" component into youth work readiness training, guidance and technical assistance for programs employing youth



Future Ready Oregon Reporting & Collaboration

- Aligning data and outcome definitions and reporting with HECC Office of Research & Data
- Developing Data and Narrative reporting tools capturing key <u>metrics</u> for Future Ready reporting and <u>success stories</u> from youth and programs

YDD Grant Reporting Guiding Principles

- Consistency with other Future Ready programs
- Ease of use for grant recipients
- Information goes both ways give programs feedback on their outcomes and success



Future Ready Oregon Reporting & Collaboration

- Improving Data Collection participant intake protocols for service providers effective, transparent and appropriate conversations about data collection
- Youth Employment Practices tools assistance for grantees providing paid work experiences to ensure adherence to workplace and employment law
- Workplace Protections for Youth Developing BOLI-informed workplace rights training for youth who participate in YDD grant programs
