Phase I: Pre-Event Planning August 2021 → July 14, 2022

- Risk Identification and Threat Assessments
- Impact Assessments
- Capacity Assessments
- Plan Development
- Training & Exercising
- Plan Revisions

Phase II: World Games Event July 15 → 25, 2022

- Proactive, real-time monitoring and timely response
- Operational Command Posts and Emergency Operations Center with connection to State of Oregon and federal partners.
- Proactive posture to problem solve operational issues and respond to emergencies if required.

Phase III: After Action Review July 26 → September 30, 2022

- Document lessons learned and process improvement for public safety, security, emergency management for large scale events.
- Develop plans to improve multi agency coordination and response capabilities.
