

TASK FORCE ON RESILIENT EFFICIENT BUILDING

AFTER MEETING FOLLOW UP

81st Legislative Assembly 2021-2022 Interim

There was a request for feedback after the meeting on May 17, 2022. Below is an email with feedback from Andrew Beyer:

- 1. We need current, accurate data about energy usage and carbon footprints of existing buildings in Oregon (similar to the NYS data):
 - a. Residential
 - b. Commercial
 - c. Industrial
 - d. Public
- 2. We need data about the anticipated construction of new buildings over a 3-5 year window, or some annual assumptions about new construction in each of those building sectors that we could, ideally, extrapolate out a decade. If our consultants could then calculate energy usage per sector of new construction we would then have comparative data, new vs existing.
- 3. As Jay Hansen suggested, what is the gap we are trying to close and where are the opportunities to do so?
- 4. Clarifying priorities using impact criteria would be helpful. Given the broad cross-section of potential benefits, I suggest we create a partial list with range of effect that could include:
 - a. Low income housing benefits
 - b. Reducing percentage spent on energy cost, per household
 - c. Air quality and public health
 - d. Air quality in public buildings, especially schools
 - e. Energy efficiency improvement, per sector
 - f. Heat mitigation
 - g. Smoke mitigation
 - h. Building resilience (if we can define it)
 - i. Carbon reduction
 - j. Cost efficiency
 - k. Ability to fund short term, medium term, long term
 - I. The Task Force could wrestle with assigning priority weight or ordinal sequence to the list. At the moment our individual priorities are neither clear nor articulated, much less the committee's.
- 5. Technology as a subset of analysis
 - a. What new technologies could/would we recommend to the state?
 - b. What appliance standards could be applied (or what are the new standards going to do)?
 - c. Heat pumps, solar, wind, battery backup
 - d. Hydrogen

This summary has not been adopted or officially endorsed by action of the Task Force.



- 6. What "sticks and carrots" are we willing to consider? What incentive options are we willing to consider, and funding sources for same?
- 7. What great ideas from elsewhere are worth considering?
