


New Workload

- 2021-2023 budget contains significant increase for WRD
 - Over 40 new projects
 - 38 new positions
- 2021 December Special Session
 - Drought and Cannabis
 - 32 new positions



Recruitments: High Priority





Recruitments Status

- 65 positions filled to date
- 10 open recruitments
- 74 remaining
- Vacancy numbers changing: staff move into new positions, leave agency, or retire
 - 23 vacancies created from filling positions
 - 6 new vacancies due to staff leaving
- ➤ Hired a new human resources position to help with recruiting



Project Implementation



- Workgroups, new funding programs, data, legislation and associated rulemakings
- Focusing on recruitments to establish capacity to work on new projects
- Prioritization of projects

Project Progress Highlights

- Protest backlog
 - Referred 30 cases / 11 protests withdrawn from OAH (Prior average: 2-3 cases in a biennium)
- Dam safety contracts
 - 16 contracts for \$1 million in General Fund
 - 12 contracts completed/in development for \$3M of \$4M in ARPA funds
- Well Abandonment, Repair, and Replacement Fund

- Tribes-State Agency Task Force (SB 5545)




Project Progress Challenges

Planning, Collaboration, and Investments Section 2021-23 Biennium Work Priorities and Projects

The Planning, Collaboration, and Investments (PCI) Section within the <u>Oregon Water Resources Department</u> (WRD) builds partnerships and incentivizes Oregonians to pursue integrated and innovative solutions for complex water challenges and an uncertain water future. We do this work to achieve a secure and sustainable water future, addressing instream and out-of-stream needs, for all Oregonians and Oregon's environment, economy, communities, and cultures as outlined in <u>Oregon's Integrated Water Resources Strategy</u> and WRD's <u>2019-24 Strategic Plan</u>. The purpose of this document is to highlight our section priorities and projects for the 2021-23 biennium. We would like to transparently communicate what we are doing and what we will not be able to do this biennium.

Ongoing Operations - Day-to-day work and standard section business that spans the biennium

- Annual funding cycles for <u>Feasibility Study Grants</u> (applications due fall 2021 and 2022)
- Annual funding cycles for Water Project Grants and Loans (applications due spring 2022 and 2023)
- Grant administration
- Partner with the <u>Upper Grande Ronde River Watershed Planning Partnership</u>, supporting efforts to finalize their plan, seek state-recognition (March 2022), and transition to plan implementation
- Partner with the Mid-Coast Water Planning Partnership, supporting efforts to finalize their plan, seek staterecognition (June 2022), and transition to plan implementation
- Partner with the <u>Lower John Day Place-Based Partnership</u>, supporting efforts to finalize their plan, seek state-recognition (June 2022), and transition to plan implementation
