

# Update on SB 1536 Implementation

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### **SB 1536: HEAT RELIEF OMNIBUS**

#### Some of the major provisions of SB 1536 as passed with HB 4058 components:

- Removes barriers on renters installing cooling units (SB 1536)
- Requires new rentals to include cooling (SB 1536)
- Cooling spaces funding for both local governments and landlords (SB 1536)
- Emergency Air Conditioner Deployment (HB 4058)
- Modest changes to Healthy Homes Program (HB 4058)
- Two heat pump incentive programs (SB 1536 and HB 4058)





# SB 1536 at ODOE

- Cooling Spaces Program for Landlords - Energy Trust of Oregon
- Study on Cooling Availability in Affordable Housing
- Heat Pumps for Renters Program
- Heat Pump Deployment Program



### HEAT PUMPS FOR RENTERS PROGRAM


#### Total State Investment: \$15 million

- Landlords work with contractors to apply for rebates
- Includes funds to be used for necessary electrical upgrades
- Shared responsibility: can cover up to 60% of the cost of the heat pump
- Sunsets January 2025





### HEAT PUMP DEPLOYMENT PROGRAM



The 11 regions used for this program are based on the Regional Solutions map.

#### Total State Investment: \$10 million

- Regional administrators contract with ODOE and design a heat pump deployment program that works best for their region
- Up to 100% of heat pump costs can be covered
- Prioritizes:
  - Homes with no cooling or heating
  - Homes with "bulk fuel" heating oil, wood, etc.
  - Environmental Justice Communities
