OCEAN POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Governor has reappointed the following individual to the Ocean Policy Advisory Council, subject to Senate confirmation:¹

Statement of Economic Interest²

Not required.

Composition³

The council is composed of 24 members:

- the Governor or a designee, nonvoting (MINER);
- a representative from the governing body of Coos, Curry, Douglas or Lane County approved by a majority of the members of those bodies (MAIN);
- a representative from the governing body of Clatsop, Lincoln or Tillamook County approved by a majority of the members of those bodies (YAMAMOTO);
- an elected city official from a coastal city bordering the territorial sea with advice from an Oregon Coastal Zone Management Association (RECHT);
- the director or a designee, nonvoting, from the Department of Environmental Quality (HOOFF), the Department of Fish and Wildlife (BRABY), the Department of Geology and Mineral Industries (MADIN), the Department of Land Conservation and Development (SNOW), the Department of State Lands (CELENTANO), the Parks and Recreation Department (SUMPTION), the Department of Agriculture (ENG), and the Oregon State University Sea Grant College (WALKER); and

- one representative each from commercial ocean fisheries from Newport north (VACANT); commercial ocean fisheries of south of Newport (CHAMBERS); charter, sport, or recreation ocean fisheries from Newport north (HOLLOWAY); charter, sport or recreation ocean fisheries south of Newport (**HEAP**); ports, marine navigation, or transportation (CHUCK); coastal nonfishing recreation interests (surfing, diving, kayaking, or windsurfing) (PLYBON); a coastal conservation or environmental organization (BROCK); tribes (after consultation with the Commission on Indian Services) (CORVI); a coastwide organization representing a majority of small ports and local governments, nonvoting (MONROE); a statewide conservation or environmental organization (LIEBEZEIT); and two representatives of the public, at least one of whom resides in a county bordering the territorial sea (FEREDAY and JOYCE).

Appointees serve four-year terms and are eligible for reappointment. Voting members elect a chair and a majority of voting members constitute a quorum. The council meets at least once every six months.

Duties⁴

The council advises the Governor, the State Land Board, state agencies and local governments on certain ocean resource management issues and provides a forum to discuss related policy and planning, and when appropriate, mediate disagreements. Its duties include:

- reviewing the Territorial Sea Plan periodically and submitting recommendations to state agencies on the council;
- recommending changes to the Oregon Ocean Resources Management Plan;
- advancing policies on the conservation and use of ocean resources to the federal government and multistate entities;
- encouraging federal agencies to participate in discussion and resolution of ocean resources planning and management issues;
- establishing administration of a permanent scientific and technical advisory committee chaired by the director of the Sea Grant College program or other similarly qualified council member;
- working with the Department of Land Conservation and Development and any Oregon coastal zone management association to achieve goals specified in the Oregon Ocean Resources Management Plan and Territorial Sea Plan;
- consulting with the Department of Fish and Wildlife concerning potential sites for marine reserve designation; and
- appointing a member to serve on the Oregon Coordinating Council on Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia.

The board may also establish advisory committees; establish project review panels to coordinate government interests in specific development proposals; and invite federal agencies to designate a liaison to participate in council meetings.
