## **Composition**<sup>3</sup>

The commission consists of 15 Oregon residents who are well informed concerning the principles of higher education:

- one each from Oregon's five congressional districts (FAJARDO (CD1), EDWARDS (CD2), CROSS (CD3), DEVLIN (CD4) and HAMANN (CD5));
- four members of the general public (ADAMS, BECKER, LUJAN-VALERIO and ROWE);
- one undergraduate student at a public university (ARNOT);
- one graduate student at a public university (SIPELLI);
- one faculty member at a public university (SIMNITT);
- one student at a community college (VALDOVINOS TORRES);
- one faculty member at a community college (ROJAS-GALVÁN); and,
- one staff person from either a community college or a public university (MATIAS).

Appointees representing congressional districts and the public serve four years, and higher education appointees serve two; all are eligible for reappointment. Official organizations at community colleges and public universities may make recommendations for appointees to higher education positions. Appointees may be removed for cause after notice and public hearing, but not more than three within a period of four years unless it is for corrupt conduct in office. The commission selects its chair and vice chair, meets at least once every three months, and a majority constitutes a quorum.

#### **Duties**<sup>4</sup>

The commission works to ensure access to post-secondary education and academic success. It also convenes groups, institutions and other stakeholders across the spectrum of public and private higher education. Its duties include:

- establishing educational attainment goals for adults not currently enrolled in a post-secondary training program in coordination with the State Workforce and Talent Development Board;
- appointing an executive director;
- developing goals for the state post-secondary education system and for student access programs;
- determining strategic investments to achieve goals;
- coordinating the post-secondary elements of data collection with the advice and recommendations of others as appropriate to construct a longitudinal data system and administering that system;
- adopting a strategic plan to achieve post-secondary education goals;
- making recommendations to the governor for a consolidated higher education agency request budget aligned with the strategic plan each biennium;
- approving or denying any significant change to the academic program of a community college or public university;
- approving mission statements adopted by public universities, reviewing specified proposed fee increases, advising the governor and the legislature with respect to university governance issues, and authorizing degrees;
- authorizing degrees offered by independent post-secondary institutions;
- overseeing the regulation of career schools;
- conducting statewide longitudinal studies and reporting on early learning, kindergarten through grade 12 education, higher education, and workforce programs in coordination with the Department of Education, the Employment Department, and others;
- implementing a review process to take appropriate action on student complaints;
- ensuring implementation of diverse educator recruitment plans;
- working with institutions of higher education to carry out specified goals and appoint an advisory committee to coordinate implementation;
- administering specified funds and grant programs;

- monitoring and reporting on participation of specified groups in higher education, including veterans and current and former foster children;
- conducting annual reviews of each public institution of higher education with respect to the employment of all employee groups at the institution; and
- developing standards related to the transfer and award of education credits in consultation with community colleges and public universities.

#### The commission may also:

- establish advisory and technical committees;
- enter into contracts and agreements;
- refer the investigation and resolution of a student complaint as appropriate to the nature and content of any allegations made;
- accept donated money or property;
- apply for funds from any source and arrange for receipt as appropriate; and
- prescribe tests and other measures or procedures to evaluate high school equivalency tests.
