Statement of Economic Interest²

Required.

Composition³

The board consists of nine commissioners who are U.S. citizens, and Oregon residents for at least a year immediately preceding appointment. They serve four-year terms and may be removed for malfeasance. A minimum of two must reside in each county constituting the port district:

- Clackamas County (LAM and STRADER);
- Multnomah County (ALEXANDER, CUPRILL-COMAS, NIEMI and O'HOLLAREN);
- Washington County (LUTHER and SAMPAT); and
- Counties outside the port district (COBA).

The Governor designates the president of the board, and the president designates a vice president, treasurer, and secretary. The board must meet at least once a month. If a commissioner refuses to serve, no longer qualifies, or fails to attend any duly noticed meetings for 60 successive days, their appointment may be vacated.

Duties⁴

The board sets policy for operation of the Port of Portland, including:

- overseeing port finances, including the issuance and sale of revenue bonds and the approval of contracts for work and materials;
- determining the fair value of port property; and
- assessing damages and benefits of filling for reclamation of any low, swamp, or submersible land contemplated by the port.

The board may:

- regulate the disposition of obstructions from rivers, harbors, and waterways controlled by the port, by ordinance;
- create executive committees as specified;
- regulate internal port operations via ordinances; and
- provide for policing or regulating the use of port and related properties by ordinance.
