No need to focus only on behavioral health in the recommendation. • TF members still want to work through the transition recommendations • Possible idea of starting the board right away and place it in charge of transition work. Keep transition and implementation as a continuum. • Concern that transition funding is not decided first before answering other questions • Possible recommendation that transition should focus on the delivery system <p>Member Topics of Review</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Behavioral Health <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Clarification needed on if recommendation will discuss behavioral health in the delivery system or in the financing system ○ Behavioral health should be addressed in the final report but should focus on the theme. Use this as a guideline for the transition to single payer. • Health Equity <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ TF recommends members and staff highlight health equity (including gender-affirming care) in final report • Worker’s Compensation <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Clarification needed on which parts of worker’s comp should be in single payer system, coverage for injury, compensation for loss, or both ○ Recommended to leave worker’s comp system in tact for now and to be discussed further by future transision group. • Border State Employees <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The universal health plan is for residents of Oregon and non-residents should hold the same status they currently do for other Oregon services • Personal Income Tax <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Leave further revenue analysis to the legislature ○ Recommend principles to legislature around rate setting
