Gambling Harm in Oregon

Gambling treatment providers see increased gambling harm with increase

- Access to gambling (platforms or brick and mortar)
 - Hours available to gamble
 - Speed of play
 - Wager amounts (Lottery VLT's now \$5 per spin)
 - Tolerance / platform switching
 - Technological advances
 - Marketing

Gambling Treatment in Oregon

Challenges treatment providers currently face:

Lack of clients seeking treatment services (less than 1%)
Gambling is a chronic, progressive diagnosis
Responsibility placed on affected individuals
Lack of standardized regulatory protections
Co-occurring challenges
Early onset – role of sports

Future handheld digital concerns

Chance disguised as skill (sports) Not seeing losses as real money (cashless) Losing track of time / \$ lost Invisible illness Increased addiction rate (from 2.6% to 9.2%) Workforce crisis
