









Average Length of Stay - All Discharges Providence Oregon (2019-2022)

Why are patients "stuck"

- No accepting facility
- Waiting for placement by state
- Eligibility assessment and approval
- Complex medical, dialysis
- Lack of decisionmaker or guardianship

Providence Portland (6/8/2022),

60 patients with LOS > 15 and "not appropriate for hospital services":

> 48 % ICF

> 29 % SNF


> 10 % memory care

> 6 % LTAC

8 patients awaiting outpatient hemodialysis chairs




Even patients "going home" need more help





Adult Foster Home Hospital Decompression Initiative (1/22-3/22)

- <u>Very</u> impactful Lots of positive feedback
- Interestingly, not the graph we expected



Adult Foster Home Hospital Decompression

- ≈ 70 Providence patients placed during this program
 - Some of our tougher patients to help
 - Average LOS of 41 days (Longest = 298 Days)
- Deep Dive analysis of subset of these patients
 - Matched them to patients with similar diagnoses
 - Decompression Initiative ≈ 48 days sooner than "longest" cases
 - $48 \times 70 = 3,360 \text{ days}$
 - Even 25% of that = 840 days
- Impact: Placing 70 AFH Patients creates room for 168 new patients*



Capacity & Throughput Affects Everything
