At a time when all Oregon state agencies have been impressively mandated by Governor Kate Brown to reduce the carbon output of their activities and jurisdictions, I am baffled and disconcerted that Governor Brown has nominated someone like Lee Beyer to sit on the Oregon Transportation Commission. Transportation is considered Oregon's leading contributor of carbon into our atmosphere.
