Statement of Economic Interest³

Not required.

Composition⁴

The federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act requires the Governor of each state to establish a state workforce development board. Membership must generally include:

- the Governor (GASTON, designee);
- members of each chamber of the State legislature appointed by the appropriate presiding officer of such chamber (DEMBROW, HOLVEY AND THATCHER); and
- members appointed by the Governor representing: businesses (CAMPBELL, CORBETT, CREMONA WAGNER, FUNKE, HOPEWELL, JOHNSON, LEMIEUX, LEWIS, MADDEN, MERSEREAU, NAGASUBRAMANIAN, POOL, POPKIN, PRICHARD, RADIE, RANSOM, REYNOLDS, ROGERS, ULVI, VENKATRAMAN and WIRZ); workforce (BELISLE, DAZEY, DUNN, NICHOLSON, PANIAN, RICHARDS and WATSON); government (CANNON, DORROH, ERICKSON, HARDER, HUNT and OZOLS); other interested groups (MITSUI, REIBACH and RHODES); and ex officio members (BITTON, CHRISTENSEN, FRAZIER and OVERBECK).

Business representatives must make-up the majority of board members and the Governor must select one to serve as chair (Mersereau). Workforce representatives must make up at least 20 percent; and one member must represent a local workforce development board

(Ransom). Legislators appointed to the board are nonvoting members and may only act in an advisory capacity.

Duties⁵

The board assists the Governor with the design, implementation, and modification of Oregon's workforce development plan and system, including:

- review of statewide policies, programs, and actions that are recommended to achieve a comprehensive and streamlined system;
- development of ongoing improvements to the system;
- developing and updating comprehensive performance accountability measures;
- identifying and disseminating information on best practices;
- development and review of statewide policies affecting the coordinated provision of services through the state's one-stop delivery system;
- developing strategies for technological improvements to facilitate access to, and improve the quality of, services provided through the one-stop delivery system;
- developing strategies to align technology and data systems across one-stop partner programs to enhance service delivery and improve efficiencies in reporting performance accountability measures;
- developing allocation formulas for the distribution of funds to local areas for employment and training activities for adults and for youth workforce investments;
- preparing annual reports;
- developing a workforce and labor market information system and a statewide employment statistics system;
- advising on other policies that may promote statewide objectives for, and enhance the performance of, the workforce development system;
- ensuring timely consultation and collaboration with chief elected officials, local workforce development boards, and other workforce stakeholders;
- reviewing and approving local workforce plans;
- working with local workforce development boards to increase efficiencies and align workforce programs and services with local needs;
- making recommendations to state agencies to implement the federal Act; and
- participating in the development of a coordinated statewide system of activities and services that includes both mandatory and optional partners in the one-stop delivery system.

The board must:

- make information regarding its activities available to the public on a regular basis through electronic means and open meetings;
- establish and apply objective qualifications for the position of director to ensure that the individual selected can effectively assist the board to serve its function;
- identify key industries in the state and the workforce skills needed for those industries to grow and thrive;

- identify needs for education, training, work experience and job preparation, in collaboration with workforce representatives, to ensure Oregonians access to stable high-wage jobs and advancement;
- identify opportunities for partnerships with key industry sectors to coordinate workforce and economic development, and to coordinate education in response to industry and workforce needs:
- guide local workforce development boards in the development of local workforce plans;
- adopt policies for the administration of local workforce development boards;
- advise the Employment Department in conjunction with the Employment Department Advisory Council;
- collaborate with other advisory bodies tasked with workforce development;
- work with the Oregon Business Development Commission to identify areas of common interest to efficiently align resources, recommend common strategies and provide accountability for reaching statewide goals;
- hold state workforce agencies and local workforce development boards accountable for meeting performance goals and system outcomes;
- convene, engage and coordinate with specified entities to determine needs across key
 industry sectors, ensure talent pipeline infrastructure includes certain features, utilize
 partnerships, leverage and optimize existing measures and data systems to improve
 alignment and communication, and ensure state coordination between sectors and
 across local workforce development areas; and
- coordinate and collaborate with specified entities each biennium to create a single, unified state Workforce and Talent Development Plan.

The board may also hire a director and other staff and charter and enter into performance compacts with local workforce development boards.
