House Bill 2590 (2021)

Directs task force to visit public post-secondary institutions of education to meet with prospective, current, and former students from underrepresented populations, including:

- "Underrepresented" as defined in ORS 342.120
- "Diverse" as defined in ORS 342.433
- Are from rural communities in Oregon
- Are from low-income families
- Experience disability
- Identify as LGBTQ2IA+
- Are undocumented
- Have been in foster care

House Bill 2590 (2021)

Directs task force to develop policy and funding proposals for the 2023 legislative session to address student success in the following areas:

- Access
- Retention
- Graduation
- Entry into the workforce


House Bill 2590 (2021)

Additional powers and directives:

- Form advisory subcommittees
- Presession file legislation for 2023 regular session
- Submit report to legislature by December 15, 2022

Path to Legislation

- Task force holds a work session to introduce LCs for pre-session filing (requires majority vote to introduce)
- 2. LPRO staff submit LCs to Chief Clerk or Senate Secretary (a.k.a. "parliamentarians")
- 3. Parliamentarians convert LCs into bills (e.g. "HB 1234") before session
- 4. Bills are read for the first time on the House or Senate floor
- House Speaker or Senate President (a.k.a. "presiding officers") assign bills to a committee
- 6. Chair of committee schedules a bill for a public hearing
- 7. Chair schedules a bill for a work session (requires majority vote to pass)
 - Bills may only be amended by a committee

Path to Legislation

- 8. Bill is referred to a subsequent committee (e.g. Joint Ways and Means) OR is scheduled for a vote on Senate or House floor
 - Bills referred to a joint committee are not typically referred to the secondchamber policy committee
- 9. Whole chamber votes on bill (requires majority vote to pass)
- 10. If bill passes, process repeats from step 5 in the second chamber
- 11. If bill was amended in the second chamber, it returns to the floor of the first chamber for concurrence OR a conference committee is appointed (requires majority vote to pass)
- 12. If bill passes both chambers, it is sent to the Governor for her signature in order to become law

Date	Notes
December 12, 2022	Task force meets to approve the final report and introduce legislative concepts for 2023 session
December 21, 2022	Deadline to submit legislative concepts for pre-session filing
January 17, 2023	First day of session: all bills read first time on chamber floor
March 17, 2023	Deadline to post bills for a work session on a first-chamber committee agenda
April 4, 2023	Deadline for first-chamber committees to hold a work session on any bill
May 5, 2023	Work session posting deadline for second-chamber committees
May 19, 2023	Work session deadline for second-chamber committees
June 25, 2023	Constitutional deadline for legislature to adjourn sine die
