

Default Question Block

The Co-Chairs of the Resilient Efficient Buildings Task Force would like to gauge Task Force member interest in additional information, evaluation, and discussion of the following policies regarding existing buildings. The Co-Chairs' intention is to use the results of the survey to help allocate the remainder of the Task Force's time.

The following questions ask you to prioritize your interest in *gathering more information on policy directions relating to existing buildings*. The items that the group collectively rank as having the least interest would not receive any additional analysis as a standalone policy but may be incorporated into other policies. Task Force members will have an opportunity to reconsider policy options that have moderate interest at a later date.

The results of the survey will not be categorized as support or opposition to a policy, only as what the Task Force opted to focus on in more depth.
