SUMMARY

Directs Health Licensing Office to issue provisional registration to applicant for behavior analysis interventionist registration. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to behavior analysis interventionists; creating new provisions;

amending ORS 676.815; and prescribing an effective date.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 676.815 is amended to read:

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6 676.815. (1) The Health Licensing Office shall establish by rule criteria 7 for the registration of behavior analysis interventionists. The criteria must 8 include, but are not limited to, the requirement that the applicant:

9 [(1)] (a) Have a high school diploma, a modified diploma, a certificate for 10 passing an approved high school equivalency test such as the General Edu-11 cational Development (GED) test or a degree from a post-secondary institu-12 tion;

13 [(2)] (b) Be at least 18 years of age;

14 [(3)] (c) Have successfully completed a state and nationwide criminal re-15 cords check that requires fingerprinting;

[(4)] (d) Have completed at least 40 hours of professional training in ap plied behavior analysis approved by the office by rule; and

[(5)] (e) Receive ongoing training and supervision by a licensed behavior
 analyst, by a licensed assistant behavior analyst or by another licensed
 health care professional.

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1 (2) The office shall adopt rules to establish a process to issue a 2 provisional registration to an applicant for registration under sub-3 section (1) of this section. The provisional registration:

4 (a) Must be issued within five business days of the date on which
5 the application for registration is received by the office; and

6 (b) Expires on the date on which registration is issued to the ap-7 plicant or, if the applicant is denied registration, on the date on which 8 registration is denied.

9 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 676.815 by section 1 of this
 10 2023 Act apply to applications received on and after the operative date
 11 specified in section 3 of this 2023 Act.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) The amendments to ORS 676.815 by section 1 of this
 2023 Act become operative on January 1, 2024.

(2) The Health Licensing Office may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary
to enable the office to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions and
powers conferred on the office by the amendments to ORS 676.815 by
section 1 of this 2023 Act.

20 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2023 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date 21 on which the 2023 regular session of the Eighty-second Legislative 22 Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
