3 Whereas manufacturers have played an enormous role in driving Oregon's

4 economy, with \$22.61 billion in manufactured goods exported in 2020; and

5 Whereas manufacturing in Oregon accounts for 13.55 percent of the total

6 product output of this state; and

7 Whereas revenues generated from the manufacturing sector are critical

for the support of public education and community and social services, for

9 health care investments and for the development and upkeep of roads and

10 infrastructure; and

Whereas Oregon leads the way on a stunningly diverse portfolio of man-

12 ufactured goods, including semiconductors and computer parts, wood and

13 fabricated metal products, food and beverages, pharmaceuticals and medicine,

14 paper, chemicals, industrial machinery and precision aerospace equipment;

- Whereas in 2021, Oregon's 6,462 manufacturing establishments provided
- 3 186,000 jobs to nearly 10 percent of the workforce in this state; and
- 4 Whereas Oregon's time-honored tradition of crafting high-quality wood
- 5 products has led to some of the highest paid manufacturing jobs in this state,
- 6 with sawmills, millwork and the veneer and engineered hardwood products
- 7 sectors all offering highly competitive wages; and
- 8 Whereas wages for manufacturing jobs in this state have climbed steadily
- 9 over the past two decades as Oregon has asserted its position as a leader of
- 10 natural resources-based manufacturing and established itself as a hub for
- 11 high-tech manufacturing; and
- Whereas in 2021, the average annual wage for manufacturing in Oregon
- was about \$78,400, far exceeding the average annual wage of \$64,000 in this
- 14 state; and
- Whereas Oregon is training the workforce of the future by investing in
- 16 science, technology, engineering and math education, bolstering apprentice-
- 17 ships and designing community college and technical school certificate pro-
- 18 grams that lead to highly desirable manufacturing jobs; and
- Whereas Oregon has seen steady job growth in manufacturing sectors
- 20 including semiconductors, pharmaceuticals and medicine, food and beverages,
- 21 medical equipment and supplies, motor vehicles, wood products, industrial
- 22 machinery and fruit and vegetable preservation; and
- 23 Whereas Oregon's 20 percent growth in manufacturing jobs far outpaces
- 24 the national average of 11.7 percent; and
- 25 Whereas Oregon is on track to create 21,000 new manufacturing jobs be-
- 26 tween 2020 and 2030; and
- 27 Whereas Oregon's diverse manufacturing sector constitutes a fundamental
- 28 component of this state's identity, and will remain so as it continues to grow;

- 30 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 31 SECTION 1. The first Friday in October of each year is designated

2	SECTION 2. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate pres
3	ervation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is de-
4	clared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage.
