



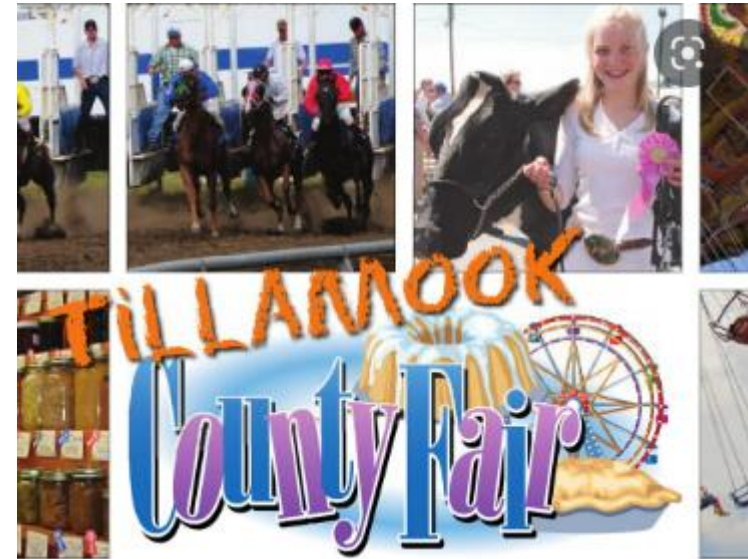

Responsible Wagering:

Our track is required to have signage and training for staff.

The ADW licensees must:

- Have appropriate signage on websites
- Provide annual training of staff members who interact with the wagering public
- Have resources online for responsible wagering for account holders
- Maintain a list of self-excluded customers

New rules require one, three, five-year or lifetime exclusion options

Responsible wagering messaging is now required on advertisements

Requirement to stop all future direct advertisements for any individuals
