LC 1164 appropriates money for distribution to the Community Economic Coalition to create a center for community economics. (Dated 12/5/22)

LC 1172 makes changes to the agency rulemaking process, including to public notice and explanation requirements. (Dated 11/9/22)

LC 1173 establishes the Office of Business Ombudsman within the Office of the Governor and transfers the duties, functions, and powers of the Office of Small Business Assistance to the Ombudsman's Office. (Dated 11/15/22)

LC 1174 creates a tax credit for employers that add and maintain new, full-time positions. (Dated 11/14/22)

LC 1175 creates income and corporate excise tax credits for manufacturing, headquarters, and research facilities as well as a tax credit for employers that add and maintain new, full-time positions. Makes additional changes to tax credit programs and extends sunsets for several current economic incentive programs. (Dated 12/2/22)

LC 1182 requires the Oregon Business Development Department to study and evaluate land availability and site readiness within the Portland Metro and Willamette Valley areas for the development and expansion of the semiconductor industry. (Dated 12/2/22)

LC 1194 extends the sunsets for several economic incentive programs and establishes the Oregon Industrial Site Readiness Program within the Oregon Business Development Department. (Dated 11/10/22)

LC 1197 appropriates money for distribution to the Knight Campus Graduate Internship Program at the University of Oregon. (Dated 12/1/22)

LC 1199 requires the Oregon Business Development Department to study sports funding in Oregon. (Placeholder, Dated 10/10/22)

LC 1234 requires the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish a statewide semiconductor industry consortium, to appoint a panel of semiconductor industry representatives to advise the Commission, and to develop a method for providing financial rewards to higher education institutions that produce graduates in semiconductor industry related fields. (Dated 12/1/22)

LC 1390 requires the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to study alcohol. (Placeholder, Dated 9/29/22)

LC 1392 requires the Oregon Business Development Department to study the department's role in economic development in Oregon. (Placeholder, Dated 11/29/22)

LC 1394 requires the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to study cannabis. (Placeholder, Dated 9/29/22)

LC 1395 requires the Oregon Business Development Department to study economic development in Oregon. (Placeholder, Dated 11/29/22)

LC 3047 establishes the Semiconductor Faculty Sustaining Fund, appropriates funds, and directs Oregon public research universities to recruit and hire faculty in semiconductor industry related fields. (Dated 12/1/22)

LC 3494 requires the House and Community Services Department to study housing. (Placeholder, Dated 12/5/22)
