




Oregon State Hospital Utilization






Aid & Assist Demand

HB 5042 (2021) Aid and Assist Funds

- \$21M to Community Mental Health Programs
 - Bringing total funds in 2021-23 to \$34.5M
- Dedicated to serve Aid and Assist population to:
 - Reduce the number of individuals found unfit to proceed via diversion efforts
 - If unable to divert, decrease the number of those who are referred and admitted to Oregon State Hospital (OSH) for restoration services (i.e., increase capacity for effective community restoration)
 - For those ultimately admitted to OSH, reduce lengths of stay


