### 1. LC 392 (dated 6/27/2022): Relating to registration of business entities that qualify as data brokers

**Introduction:** At the request of Attorney General Ellen Rosenblum

**Summary:** Provides that data broker may not collect, sell or license brokered personal data within this state unless data broker first registers with Department of Consumer and Business Services.

### 2. LC 1478 (dated 10/28/2022): Relating to violations of a requirement to register assumed business names

**Introduction:** At the request of John Huddle

**Summary:** Provides that person that carries on, conducts or transacts business in a county in Oregon under assumed business name that a person has not registered or a person does not maintain registration lacks standing in courts of this state to maintain action on behalf of business.

### 3. LC 1479 (dated10/21/2022): Relating to the status of district attorneys in the Public Employees Retirement System

**Introduction:** At request of Multnomah County Prosecuting Attorneys Association **Summary:** Provides that district attorneys and deputy district attorneys qualify as police officers under Public Employees Retirement System.

# 4. LC 1490 (dated 11/22/2022): Relating to procedures for conducting cooperative procurements for public contracts

**Introduction:** At the request of Oregon Public Purchasing Association

**Summary:** Updates and streamlines process and procedure for conducting cooperative procurements for public contracts and public improvement contracts.

#### 5. LC 1500 (dated 10/18/2022): Relating to self-insurance of public bodies

**Introduction**: At the request of Special Districts Association of Oregon **Summary**: Modifies provisions relating to use of contributions and reserves of self insurance programs established by multiple public bodies to insure against tort liability or property damage.

### 6. LC 2204 (dated 11/28/2022): Relating to wages

Introduction: At the request of Northwest Carpenters Union

**Summary:** Makes contractor liable for unpaid wages, including other benefit payment or contributions of employee of subcontractor at any tier.

### 7. LC 2207 (dated 11/21/2022): Relating to financial assistance for agricultural overtime compensation payments

**Introduction:** At the request of Rep. Paul Holvey

**Summary:** Directs Oregon Business Development Department to administer loan program to provide financial assistance to eligible employers to mitigate costs associated with compliance with agricultural overtime requirements.

### 8. LC 2232 (dated 11/7/2022): Relating to unused accumulated sick leave of public employees

**Introduction:** At the request of Oregon Education Association

**Summary:** Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to establish procedure by which employees of certain public employers who are leaving employment may donate unused accumulated sick leave to be used by other employees of public employers.

## 9. LC 2561 (dated 10/31/2022): Relating to insurance coverage for drivers that are affiliated with transportation network companies.

**Introduction:** At the request of Oregon Trial Lawyers Association

**Summary:** Applies insurance requirements for drivers that provide transportation services in affiliation with transportation network companies to drivers that provide delivery services to customers in affiliation with transportation network companies.
