Re: Committee drafts for introduction on December 8, 2022

1. **LC 742 (dated 11/2/22)** is a placeholder relating to the state administration of education.
2. **LC 1031 (dated 9/15/22)** increases the reimbursement rate for vision screening and appropriates \$2 million for the Vision Health Account.
3. **LC 1055** directs the Department of Corrections and the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to enter into a memorandum of understanding regarding the corrections education system in order to facilitate data sharing and cooperation on implementing new federal regulations.
4. **LC 1059 (dated 9/16/22)** is a placeholder relating to the kindergarten through grade 12 workforce.
5. **LC 1089 (dated 9/21/22)** requires the Oregon Department of Education to modify the calculation of weighted average daily membership (ADMw) for certain virtual public charter schools if the sponsoring school district had a decrease in ADMw.
6. **LC 1092 (dated 9/20/22)** is a placeholder relating to educator mobility through an interstate agreement.
7. **LC 1093 (dated 9/20/22)** is a placeholder relating to online education.
8. **LC 1095 (dated 11/23/22)** allows adults in custody at state correctional institutions to apply for, and enroll in, any community college-operated academic program, regardless of the physical location of the correctional institution and whether it is located within a community college service district.
9. **LC 1096 (dated 9/21/22)** requires the Oregon Department of Education to maintain an official record of school district boundaries within the state, and requires the Higher

Education Coordinating Commission to maintain an official record of community college district boundaries within the state.

10. **LC 1097 (dated 9/21/22)** appropriates an unspecified amount of money to the Oregon Department of Education to conduct a comprehensive review of the methodology used to produce the biennial Quality Education Model report.
11. **LC 1104 (dated 9/20/22)** is a placeholder related to employment-related day care.
12. **LC 1148 (dated 11/16/22)** requires the Legislative Policy and Research Office to conduct a study of the barriers to obtaining insurance for child care providers, and to identify and recommend strategies for improving access to insurance for child care providers.
13. **LC 1357 (dated 9/29/22)** is a placeholder relating to the education workforce.
14. **LC 1452 (dated 11/18/22)** requires the Department of Administrative Services to prepare a tentative budget for funding the State School Fund each biennium. Establishes requirement to form a committee for the purpose of preparing the tentative budget. Outlines committee membership requirements and procedures.
15. **LC 1523 (dated 10/14/22)** requires Oregon Health and Science University to exempt COFA islanders, refugees, and special immigrant visa holders from paying nonresident tuition and fees beginning in the 2023-2024 academic year.
16. **LC 1579 (dated 11/7/22)** modifies the matching provisions of the Oregon School Capital Improvement Matching (OSCIM) Program. Requires the State Board of Education to adjust grant calculations for inflation. Increases the amount allowed for technical assistance grants and requires the State Board of Education to adjust this amount each biennium for inflation.
17. **LC 1702 (dated 10/28/22)** establishes a task force on school starting times.
18. **LC 1804 (dated 11/14/22)** requires the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to adopt rules to allow for licensure of individuals that study in specialized educator preparation programs for teachers of students who are deaf or hard of hearing outside the state of Oregon.
19. **LC 2598 (dated 10/7/22)** is a placeholder relating to higher education.
20. **LC 2600 (dated 10/7/22)** is a placeholder relating to higher education.
21. **LC 3271 (dated 11/2/22)** modifies the requirements for the Oregon Department of Education's investigations of complaints that the Department of Education, a local education agency, or an early intervention/early childhood special education contractor has violated federal special education laws.
22. **LC 3277 (dated 11/23/22)** repeals certain sections of statute and requires the Oregon Department of Education to determine annually if a school district or education service district is standard, nonstandard, or conditionally standard and publish its determinations. Defines standard, nonstandard, and conditionally standard. Establishes procedures for

districts that are found to be nonstandard or conditionally standard. Prescribes enforcement actions for districts that do not correct deficiencies.

- 23. LC 3280 (dated 11/23/22)** modifies the duties of the State Board of Education, Department of Education, Superintendent of Public Instruction, and local school boards to give the Oregon Department of Education the authority to enforce state and federal education laws and to require local actions to be consistent with state and federal education laws.
- 24. LC 3282 (dated 11/22/22)** requires the Oregon Department of Education to investigate whether public schools are in compliance with specific statutes and order schools to take corrective action when out of compliance.
- 25. LC 3354 (dated 9/29/22)** is a placeholder relating to education.
- 26. LC 3355 (dated 10/4/22)** is a placeholder relating to education.
- 27. LC 3356 (dated 9/29/22)** is a placeholder relating to education.
- 28. LC 3357 (dated 9/29/22)** is a placeholder bill relating to early childhood.
